

**Diane Daiber**, R.N., BSN, SANE-A. A nurse for 27 years at Cleveland Clinic Hillcrest Hospital, she developed and coordinates the Forensic Nursing Services Department. She is also a founding member of Geauga and Cuyahoga Co. SARTs. Diane was the 2009 President of the Ohio Chapter of International Association of Forensic Nurses (IAFN). She provides yearly SANE education to nurses and facilitates their practical experience and is an active member of the Ohio Sexual Assault Response Training Team. Diane, advocates for prevention of violence as a member of the work group creating the IAFN Prevention of Sexual Violence Road Map and has been teaching awareness and prevention in schools and Universities since 2005.

**John Radabaugh**, Detective Sergeant. John has been with the Delaware Police Department since 1993. He has served as a Detective Sergeant for the past 5 years and mostly handles sexual assault cases. In addition to his current position, he has been a law enforcement instructor since 1998 and is a graduate from the Police Executive Leadership College.
