## Narrative:

On Wednesday, October 19, 2022, at 1216 hours, Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation (BCI) Special Agent (SA) Joseph Goudy (Goudy) and SA Todd Clark interviewed Tuscarawas County Sheriff's Office (TCSO) Deputy (Dep.) (D

Dep. Stated he has been in law enforcement for approximately three months overall. At the time of the incident, Dep. Started day one of "Phase III" of his Field Training Program. Dep. Still Training Officer (FTO) was Sergeant (Sgt.) States and the Ohio (Dep. States and the TCSO since July of 2022, when he graduated the Ohio Highway Patrol Basic Peace Officer Academy on July 7, 2022. He is currently assigned to day shift, 6 AM to 6 PM, with rotating days off. Dep. States was working the 6 AM to 6 PM shift at the time of the incident. Dep. States goes by call sign states and utilized that number while communicating with dispatch.

On the day of the incident, September 28, 2022, Dep. was assigned to TCSO marked unit Dep. described the unit as having visible Buckeye State Sheriff's Association (BSSA) markings around the entire vehicle, along with operable overhead emergency lights and sirens. At the time of the incident, Dep. stated the lights and sirens were working and utilized.

When asked about the uniform Dep. **Was** wearing on the day of the incident, he described it as the standard BSSA uniform pants and shirt with TCSO deputy sheriff patches, along with an external vest containing his sheriff star badge and nameplate. Dep. **Wassen** stated he was well represented as a law enforcement officer on the day of the incident. Dep. **Wassen** stated he carried an assortment of equipment on his duty belt, to include: three spare magazines for his duty issued Smith and Wesson 2.0 9mm handgun, asp and radio. When asked about the ammunition Dep. **Wassen** had available to him, he stated each magazine has a 17-round capacity.

Dep. went on to say that he only carries 16 rounds in each magazine, totaling 64 rounds, plus the one round in the chamber to make 65 total rounds.

Dep. Stated that prior to the incident, he and his FTO, Sgt. Were dispatched to 5611 East Third Street for a Temporary Protection Order Violation (TPO). When they arrived on scene, Dep. Stated he observed Everett Martin's (Martin) truck parked in front of the residence. Dep. Stated when he exited his patrol vehicle, he walked up to the truck to see if Martin was inside, in which, he was not. Dep. Stated when he and Sgt. Stated began to approach the front of the residence, they noticed Martin on the right side of the house toward the rear.

After Dep. **Mathematical and Set. Dep. Stated, due to his not being able to get through to Martin, Sgt. Took over communications with Martin, due to having a repoire with him after dealing with him a week prior. While Sgt. Was speaking with Martin, Martin continued to make statements of "killing himself." Dep. Stated they asked Martin if he had a gun on him; Martin said he did not, but he had a knife and that he was going to "lie down and die." Immediately after, Martin was heard saying he was going to blow his brains out. Dep. Stated, at this point, they asked Martin, again, if he had a gun and Martin denied having a gun. Dep. Martin Stated Martin denied having a gun and said he meant to say he was going to "slit his throat."

While Sgt. was speaking with Martin, Dep. with a stated additional units arrived and went around the rear of the residence. Dep. with heard the units in the backyard saying, "Show us your hands." At this point, Dep. with stated that Martin turned around and began to go toward the door of the residence. Dep. with stated he then heard the less-lethal shotgun fired at Martin. At this point, Dep. with stated the less-lethal bean bag round had no effect on Martin. Dep. with after the less-lethal round was fired at Martin, he saw Martin turn around and say, "Really!"

Soon after Martin reacted to the less-lethal round, Dep. **Second** stated Martin began to reach in his waistline. At this point, Martin sat down on the ground, behind the chain link fence. While Martin was sitting on the ground, Dep. **Second** observed, through the chain link fence, Martin with a firearm in his hand at low ready. Sgt. **Second** yelled out, "Gun! Gun!" At this point, Dep. **Second** stated he drew his firearm from his duty holster and pointed it at Martin. Dep. **Second** stated Martin then pointed his gun at him and Sgt. **Second** s position. Dep. **Second** then stated he remembered seeing the muzzle flash from Martin's weapon but did not hear it, which resulted in Dep. **Second** firing five rounds from his weapon at Martin. Dep. **Second** further stated, he was told later that he hit Martin with three rounds. Shortly thereafter, Dep. **Second** Martin to secure him. EMS arrived on scene immediately thereafter.

When asked how many rounds Dep. **Example** fired, he stated he fired his weapon five times, striking him at least three times. The interview concluded at approximately 1252 hours.
