

This matter comes before the Court on the motion of the Director of ODJFS as filed July 20, 2012 which seeks dismissal of the complaint. The Plaintiff has not filed a response within the time prescribed by Local Rule 5(F) and the matter is ready for decision.

First, the Court agrees with Movant that a corporation cannot maintain litigation through an officer, but that it must be represented by a properly licensed attorney. See *Sheridan Mobile Village, Inc. v. Larsen*, 78 Ohio App.3d 203, 604 N.E.2d 217 (4<sup>th</sup> Dist. 1992); *Union Savings Assn. v. Home Owners Aid*, 23 Ohio St.2d 60, 262 N.E.2d 558 (1970); R.C. 4705.01.

Second, the complaint was not filed within the 30 day time set forth in R.C. 4141.282. Based upon the pleadings, the Court agrees with Movant that the complaint was not filed within the 30 days time limit set forth in R.C. 4141.282.

**IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED AND DECREED** that this matter is dismissed. Costs to the Plaintiff. Final Appealable Order.
