This case involves an appeal from the Unemployment Compensation Review Commission's ("Review Commission") Decision affirming dismissal of Juanita Hickson's

("Appellant") appeal for unemployment benefits. The Court addresses the Ohio

Department of Jobs and Family Services' ("ODJFS") Motion to Dismiss.

PROCEDURAL BACKGROUND

In this administrative appeal, the Appellant appealed the hearing officer's decision finding that she untimely appealed an Ohio Department of Job and Family Services ("ODJFS") Determination. Under R.C. 4141.281(C)(3), an interested party is required to appeal an adverse decision of a hearing officer by filing a request for review to the full Review Commission within twenty-one days. The Appellant failed to do so.

DISCUSSION

The parties appeared before the Court on the motion on July 15, 2014. The Court considered the arguments of the parties and finds that the Appellant has failed to exhaust administrative remedies.

DECISION

The Court hereby DISMISSES the Appellant's appeal for failure to exhaust her administrative remedies. The Court lacks jurisdiction to proceed with the case.
