1960 Homicide Composite Sketch

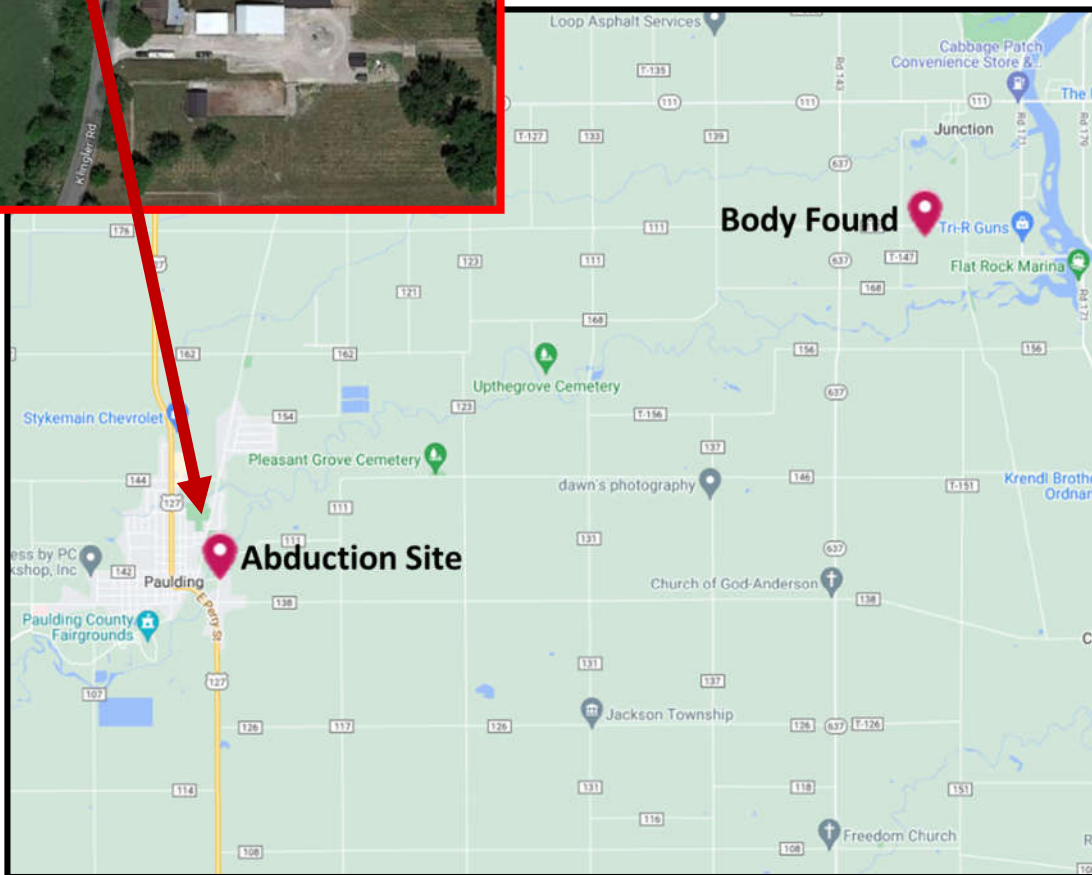
The Ohio Attorney General's Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation and Paulding County Sheriff's Office are seeking assistance in identifying a suspect in a 1960 homicide. On November 13, 1960, fourteen year –old Nancy Eagleson and her sister were walking home when Nancy was abducted, put into a vehicle, and driven away. She was found sexually assaulted and deceased the next day. Law enforcement is still working to identify her killer.

A forensic artist with the Ohio BCI completed a composite sketch with Nancy's sister. The witness stated that he was an adult white male, medium build, but couldn't estimate his age. She remembered the suspect wearing "church clothes." He was dressed up, wearing a tie, over coat and fedora. He also had black horn-rimmed glasses. She couldn't remember the details of his facial features, but didn't recall age lines or wrinkles. What stuck out to her were his rosy cheeks. She also described the vehicle as a dark sedan with a "winged back." An image without facial features and one with generic features for reference were completed and are pictured below.

Nancy was abducted at the intersection of Flatrock Dr. and E. Jackson St. and her body was recovered about 8 miles northeast of the abduction site. She was found in a wooded area off Township Road 176.
