TEMPORARY RESTRAINING ORDER

This matter came before the Court on Plaintiff State of Ohio ex. rel Mike DeWine, Attorney General's Motion for a Temporary Restraining Order and Preliminary Injunction. Upon Motion of the Attorney General and the exhibits attached to that motion, without a hearing and prior to notice being issued to the Defendants, the Court finds that the Motion is well founded.

For good cause shown, the Plaintiff's Motion is GRANTED.

IT IS ORDERED that Defendants Nancy Jo Frazer, David Frazer, Albert Rosebrock, and Focus Up Ministries, as well as their officers, agents, servants, employees, attorneys and those persons in active concert or participation with them (Collectively "Defendants"):

- Immediately cease all activities on behalf of any charitable organization/trust in the state of Ohio including, but not limited to, Focus Up Ministries, Inc., NJF Global Group, and Profitable Sunrise;
- 2. Immediately cease all acts of solicitation as defined in R.C. 1716.01(K) in the State of Ohio for any charitable purpose or charitable organization including, but not limited to, Focus Up Ministries, NJF Global Group, and Profitable Sunrise.
- 3. Immediately cease disposing of assets held in the name of or for the benefit of Focus Up Ministries, NJF Global Group, Profitable Sunrise, or any other charitable or nonprofit entity, including but not limited to cash, supplies and financial and other records;
- 4. Immediately cease withdrawing, or transferring funds from any and all financial accounts in the name of Focus Up Ministries, NJF Global Group, or any other charitable or nonprofit entity;
- 5. Pay to the Williams County Clerk of Courts all amounts withdrawn from or belonging to Focus Up Ministries or NJF Global Group, or held for their benefit, pending further order of this Court;
- Pay to the Williams County Clerk of Courts the \$20,000 cashier's check (check #1252281037) removed from Huntington Bank Account Number 03478725202, pending further order of this Court;
- 7. Provide an accounting of all assets solicited for a charitable purpose and/or held for the benefit of Focus Up Ministries, NJF Global Group, and/or Profitable Sunrise;

- 8. Immediately cease from acting as a securities dealer, salesperson, investment advisor, or investment advisor representative without first obtaining proper licensure with the Division;
- 9. Immediately cease from selling securities that are not registered with the Division or subject to an exemption from registration with the Division;
- 10. Immediately cease from engaging in any act that violates R.C. 1707.44(B)(4) or R.C. 1707.44(G);
- 11. Immediately cease from disposing of and dispersing any assets that were acquired with funds obtained from the unlawful sale of unregistered securities, including all assets held in the name of Defendants, until a full hearing can be had on the allegations in the verified complaint.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED THAT

- 12. All accounts in the name Focus Up Ministries and NJF Global Group be taken into actual and/or constructive possession by any and all banking institutions and that no withdrawals or transfers be permitted to be made;
- 13. The specific accounts in the names of Defendants Nancy Jo Frazer, David Frazer, Albert Rosebrock, and Focus Up Ministries, Inc., identified as Huntington Bank Account Numbers 01472654986, 03478725202, 02475460273, 01472636467, 02475780720, 04475411042; Fifth Third Bank Account Number 7342748253; and Farmers and Merchants Bank Account Number 2153758, be taken into actual and/or constructive possession by those banking institutions.
