Any student requesting to substitute a Non OPOTA course will need to provide a certificate of completion and a syllabus or schedule for the class showing the topics covered. The acceptance of Non OPOTA training courses is at the sole discretion of OPOTA. It is strongly encouraged to seek approval for Non OPOTA courses prior to the submission of this application.

Applicants may no longer substitute Internet Investigations for Computer Crime First Responder. These are two separate and distinct classes.

If an applicant has taken the OPOTA 80 Evidence Technician course they will receive credit for Latent Print Development 16 hours.

Computer Crime First Responder has been renamed Cyber Crime First Responder

Sex Crimes Investigation has been renamed Sexual Assault Investigation.
