### **Case Management**

- → The creation of cases from one or more linked reports
- → Flexible case titling
- Tracking of expenses, notes and case history
- → Assignment of case tasks for follow-up
- Simultaneous transfer of case clearance to all linked reports
- → Ability to link analysis diagramming

# **OH-1 Crash Report**

- Electronic submission of crash data to the Department of Public Safety
- An intuitive user interface that displays only relevant fields based on user input
- Simple and easy-to-understand validation messages
- → Ability to include crash scene diagrams

# Booking

- Ability for agencies to record the booking of suspects into a holding facility
- → Configurable medical intake questionnaire
- → Tracking of inmate's property
- Ability to attach images and documents related to the booking record

# **Intelligence Reports**

- Tracking of incoming intelligence tips and information
- Confidential and permission-driven review and submission protocols
- Ability to approve and assign incoming intelligence information
