2025 HUMAN TRAFFICKING SUMMIT

PRESENTATION PROPOSAL

The Attorney General's Human Trafficking Initiative Team is accepting proposals for breakout sessions for the 2025 Human Trafficking Summit, scheduled for July 30 at the Hyatt Regency Columbus. We look forward each year to the opportunity to benefit from the knowledge and experience of so many others.

This year, we are placing a priority on interactive presentations and case studies as a way of engaging summit attendees in more diverse ways. Panel discussions and workshops are also welcome. (For more information on presentation formats, see Page ii.)

There are 28 timeslots to fill during the daylong summit, with each running 60 minutes. Proposals should clearly delineate seating limitations and, if preferred, a seating arrangement.

Note that any presentation proposal offering practical techniques for addressing and combating human trafficking is encouraged. In addition, for 2025 we are seeking a variety of themes that address the dynamics and aftermath of trafficking in persons, from identification to access of justice. As we have in the past, we are offering presentation ideas for your consideration (see Page iii). Although your topic need not come from our list, feel free to submit one as your proposal.

Presenters who are chosen agree to volunteer their time but do receive full registration to the summit, including a continental breakfast and lunch. Summit organizers are unable to pay per diems, airport baggage or parking fees, or transportation costs to/from a presenter's home.

All proposals must be complete and submitted according to the guidelines outlined on this form on or before **April 7**. Please email your proposals to **HTI@OhioAGO.gov**. The proposals will be evaluated by the HTI Team; incomplete and unsigned proposals might not be considered.

Selected presenters will be notified by **April 25** and provided a code to have their summit registration fees waived. Presenters will be required to submit for review by **June 30** their entire presentation (outline, PowerPoint, etc.) to ensure that the material covers current training philosophies and content.

PRESENTATION FORMATS

The Human Trafficking Initiative Team at the Ohio Attorney General's Office is seeking presentations in any of the following formats:

INTERACTIVE SESSIONS

Interactive sessions are designed to enhance the learning experience through activity-based exercises, such as breakout groups, role playing, attendee movement, etc. Q&A throughout the presentation is not considered interactive. Summit interactive sessions include:

- Practical strategies and tips for implementing interactive-session content into agency policies, protocols, and practices.
- The use of real-life examples.
- Outcome-based objectives based on interactive exercise(s).

CASE STUDIES

Case studies are the most popular presentations at the Human Trafficking Summit every year, as they provide an invaluable opportunity for attendees to learn from real-life situations.

We ask that presenters walk attendees through an entire case, from investigation and prosecution to follow-up, highlighting the main "takeaways" — lessons learned, tips for interdisciplinary collaboration, innovative investigative/prosecutorial strategies, etc.

Case studies <u>must have at least two presenters from different fields</u> (prosecutor, investigator, advocate, and/or survivor). These sessions are most effective when attendees can hear the case from multiple perspectives.

PANEL DISCUSSIONS

Panel discussions address complicated issues that require a multidisciplinary and/or collaborative focus and approach. Summit panel discussions encompass:

- No more than four (4) panel members (preferably with partial or full funding).
- Panel members from diverse disciplines.
- An appointed moderator for the panel discussion.
- A Q&A opportunity either during the discussion or as the last component of the session.

WORKSHOPS

Workshops make up most of the HT Summit agenda. They vary widely in scope, but all HT Summit workshops include:

- Practical strategies and tips for implementing session content.
- Real-life examples.
- A high level of interaction.
- Time for Q&A at the end of the workshop.
