The abuse of prescription drugs in this state is epidemic.

Since 2007, drug overdoses have exceeded car crashes as Ohio's leading cause of accidental death. The death rate from overdoses has jumped 372 percent since 1999, from 327 deaths that year to 1,544 in 2010, an increase largely driven by prescription drug abuse.

To raise public awareness of the problem, we have partnered with the following organizations to alert Ohio citizens that they can report those they suspect are improperly distributing or prescribing pharmaceutical drugs.
