## Narrative:

On August 30, 2024, the Licking County Sheriff's Office (LCSO) requested the Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation (BCI) investigate an Officer-Involved Critical Incident (OICI) at 4206 Northridge Road, Alexandria, Ohio, involving officers with the LCSO, the Johnstown Police Department (JPD), and Doug Plott (Plott). Plott was ultimately shot by responding officers and succumbed to his injuries.

There were three initial responding officers. LCSO were identified as officers discharging their firearms during the incident with LCSO Deputy Nicholas Dewitt (Deputy Dewitt) being witness to the incident.

Deputy Ryan Donahue (Deputy Donahue) was identified as an officer responding after the shooting incident and assisting with medical aid. Deputy Donahue prepared a written incident report, which was provided to BCI through his legal counsel Attorney Bob Sauter on September 9, 2024.

## Deputy Donahue wrote the following:

"On 8/30/24 at approximately 0950, I arrive on scene at 4206 Northridge Road NW to assist other units on a physical domestic. When arriving on scene, I made contact with Sgt. Snodgrass S-12, who advised me to relieve Deputy DeWitt #42 who was doing compressions on the suspect.

At this time, I proceeded to start compressions. I completed approximately two round of compressions when medics arrived and advised me that I could stop and then they proceeded to take over.
