DEAR SIR: You have submitted for my approval a contract between the State of Ohio, acting by the Department of Public Works, for the Board of Trustees of Miami University, Oxford, Ohio, and R. Burton Child of Findlay, Ohio. This contract covers the construction and completion of contract for general work for a project known as Remodeling South Dormitory, Miami University, Oxford, Ohio, in accordance with Item No. 1, Item No. 7 (Alt. G-2), Item No. 8 (Alt. G-3), Item No. 10 (Alt. G-5), and substitution for fly screens, of the form of proposal dated December 16, 1935. Said contract calls for an expenditure of fifty-seven thousand, nine hundred and fifty-two dollars (\$57,952.00).

You have submitted the certificate of the Secretary of the Board of Trustees of Miami University showing that there are available moneys from funds of the University, which moneys, when supplemented by the moneys from the Federal Government, will be sufficient to cover the cost of the erection of the improvement. In addition, you have submitted a contract bond upon which the Ohio Casualty Insurance Company appears as surety, sufficient to cover the amount of the contract.

You have further submitted evidence indicating that plans were properly prepared and approved, notice to bidders was properly given, bids tabulated as required by law and the contract duly awarded. Also it appears that the laws relating to the status of surety companies and the workmen's compensation have been complied with.
