APPROVAL, CONTRACT BETWEEN STATE OF OHIO AND THE ELCON ENGR. CO., COLUMBUS, OHIO, FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF COAL HANDLING EQUIPMENT FOR INSTITUTION FOR FEEBLE-MINDED, COLUMBUS, OHIO, AT AN EXPENDITURE OF \$24,431.00—SURETY BOND EXECUTED BY THE GLOBE INDEMNITY COMPANY.

Dear Sir:—You have submitted for my approval a contract between the State of Ohio, acting by the Department of Public Welfare (Institution for Feeble-Minded, Columbus, Ohio) and The Elcon Engr. Co., of Columbus, Ohio. This contract covers the construction and completion of coal handling equipment, excavating and concrete work complete, for Institution for Feeble-Minded, Columbus, Ohio, and calls for an expenditure of \$24,431.00 coal handling equipment; \$2.50 per yd. excavating; \$25.00 concrete—1:2:4 (Per Yd.); \$20.00 concrete—1:3:5 (Per Yd.)

You have submitted the certificate of the Director of Finance to the effect that there are unencumbered balances legally appropriated in a sum sufficient to cover the obligations of the contract. You have also furnished evidence to the effect that the consent and approval of the Controlling Board to the expenditure have been obtained as required by Section 12 of House Bill No. 502 of the 87th General Assembly. In addition you have submitted a contract bond, upon which the Globe Indemnity Company appears as surety, sufficient to cover the amount of the contract.

You have further submitted evidence indicating that plans were properly prepared and approved, notice to bidders was properly given, bids tabulated as required by law and the contract duly awarded. Also it appears that the laws relating to the status of surety companies and the workmen's compensation have been complied with.

Finding said contract and bond in proper legal form, I have this day noted my approval thereon and return the same herewith to you, together with all other data submitted in this connection.

DISAPPROVAL, CONTRACT BETWEEN STATE OF OHIO AND THE CLEVELAND, CINCINNATI, CHICAGO & ST. LOUIS RAILWAY COMPANY FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF A SIDE TRACK AT LONDON PRISON FARM.

Dear Sir:—This is to acknowledge receipt of your communication submitting for my reconsideration a proposed contract between the State of Ohio and The Cleveland, Cincinnati, Chicago & St. Louis Railway Company, relating to the construction of an additional side track on and in connection with the London Prison Farm land and premises.

In Opinion No. 2522 of this department, directed to you under date of September 1, 1928, and which opinion is referred to in your communication, I advised you that I was unable to approve the contract submitted on account of certain provisions in paragraph ten (10) of said contract, whereby the State of Ohio is required to assume all responsibility for and indemnify said railway company against loss or damage to property of the state or to property upon the premises, arising from fire caused by locomotives operated by the railway company upon said track, regardless of the railway company's negligence in the operation of such locomotives, and the State of Ohio is to indemnify said railway company for loss, damage or injury to the person or property of the parties to the contract or their employes, and to the person or property of any other person, firm or corporation due to any act or omission upon the part of any agent or employe of the state. I have carefully noted the contents of your communication, as well as those of the communication of the Division Engineer of the railway company to your department touching this matter. However, neither of these communications throw any light upon the question of your power and authority to impose upon the State of Ohio the obligations contained in paragraph ten (10) of said contract above referred to; and I am still constrained to the view that I have no authority to approve said contract in its present form.
