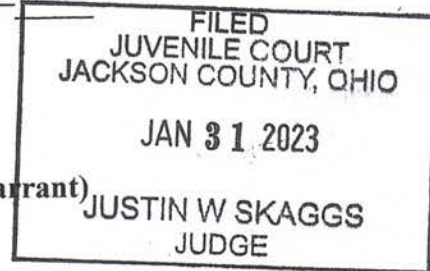

SGT. JASON WILSON, law enforcement officer and the **affiant** herein, state these facts and circumstances:

- I. The property to be searched for and seized may be involved with and evidence related to the shooting death of William Beach and criminal violations committed by William Beach that may include but are not limited to violations of Section 2923.13 of the Revised Code (Having Weapons Under Disability), Section 2911.21 of the Revised Code (Criminal Trespass).
- II. The property to be searched for and seized will be found on/at the person/place to be searched.
- III. There is reasonable cause to believe there is an urgent necessity for permission to search in the nighttime as well as the daytime.

THE FACTS UPON WHICH THE ABOVE REPRESENTATIONS ARE BASED ARE CONTAINED IN THE ATTACHED AFFIDAVIT OF SGT. JASON WILSON.

Matters to be investigated or Provisions of Law alleged to have been violated: The shooting death of William Beach and criminal violations committed by William Beach that may include but are not limited to violations of Section 2923.13 of the Revised Code (Having Weapons Under Disability), Section 2911.21 of the Revised Code (Criminal Trespass).

Person/Place to be searched:

The residence located at 1818 Jisco West Road, Jackson, Ohio, being a small, amish built style shed converted into a cabin style residence located on Parcel K200050000900 (middle cabin out of three on the property), commonly known as 1818 Jisco West Road, Jackson, Ohio 45640, and owned by Shawn Norman and Melissa Graham, and being the current residence of William Beach, along with any outbuildings, other structures and any and all vehicles and persons located on the property at the time the search warrant is executed.

- p. When all attempts to negotiate a peaceful surrender had been exhausted, officers made entry into the residence.
- q. Upon entry, officers encountered Mr. Beach who was armed.
- r. An officer discharged his service weapon, striking Mr. Beach.
- s. Officers administered first aid to Mr. Beach on the scene but he later died at Holzer Hospital.
- t. Recovered from Mr. Beach's vicinity was a hatchet, a knife and a handgun.
- u. Officers secured the scene and contacted the Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation to process the scene and investigate the incident.

ITEMS TO BE SEARCHED FOR AND SEIZED: The items to be searched for include any and all evidence showing the cause of death of one William Beach, including but not limited to: DNA, biohazard, and trace evidence; any firearm, ammunition or other weapon; cell phones, personal papers, documents, electronic or computer generated records or other items that may relate to the shooting death of one William Beach and or the criminal activity and violations committed by William Beach.

AFFIDAVIT (For Search Warrant)

Probable cause for search (facts and circumstances, stated here or in an attached exhibit):

- a. On 01/31/2023, deputies with the Jackson County Sheriff's Office responded to a report of criminal activity at 1818 Jisco West Road, Jackson, Ohio 45640.
- b. A neighbor had caught William Beach in his vehicle and drew a gun on Mr. Beach.
- c. When Deputies arrive Mr. Beach retreated into an amish-stlye shed/ cabin in which he had been staying.
- d. The structure is the middle of three similar structures on the property which is owned by Shawn Norman and Melissa Graham.
- e. Misdemeanor probation arrived on the scene to assist.
- f. Upon approaching the home to assist with taking Mr. Beach into custody, Probation officer Wes Skaggs witnessed Mr. Beach to be in possession of a hatchet and a handgun.
- g. Officers backed up to a safe distance and have made efforts to get Mr. Beach to surrender himself peacefully.
- h. Officers applied for a search warrant and asked that the statutory precondition for non-consensual entry be waived as affiant had good cause to believe that there is a risk of serious physical harm to the law enforcement officers or other authorized individuals who will execute the warrant if they are required to comply with the statutory precondition for nonconsensual entry. The facts upon which this belief was made were those included in that affidavit and included but were not limited to the knowledge that William Beach was present at the address and was armed with a hatchet and handgun and that he was currently under indictment for Assault on a Peace officer. Additionally, affiant hereby verified the address of the dwelling house or other building proposed to be searched was the correct address in relation to the criminal offense or other violation of law underlying the request.
- i. Mr. Beach still remained in the home and the matter became a stand-off.
- j. Mr. Beach was, at the time, under indictment for felony Assault on a Peace officer.
- k. Officers on scene observed that Mr. Beach had not exited the structure.
- l. Based on the facts and circumstances set out, probable cause was found to believe that the small, amish built style shed converted into a cabin style residence located on Parcel K200050000900 (middle cabin out of three on the property), commonly known as 1818 Jisco West Road, Jackson, Ohio 45640, and owned by Shawn Norman and Melissa Graham, contained evidence of violations of Section 2923.13 of the Revised Code (Having Weapons Under Disability), Section 2911.21 of the Revised Code (Criminal Trespass) and that William Beach committed those offenses and remained in the structure and was armed with a hatchet and a handgun and a warrant was issued.
- m. Law enforcement agencies on scene included the Jackson County Sheriff's Office, Jackson County Municipal Probation Department and the Ohio State Highway Patrol.
- n. Officers on scene continued to negotiate with Mr. Beach to surrender himself.
- o. Mr. Beach claimed to have taken a lot of pills and threw a prescription bottle out of the window.



GREETINGS: An affidavit having been filed before me by Deputy Jesse Reynolds, a law enforcement officer assigned to the Jackson County Sheriff's Office, being first sworn as to the truth of the facts set forth in the affidavit for a search warrant filed with the court in this matter in which he is the affiant, and which is attached to and made a part of this warrant, and which the court has reviewed.

PROBATION ORDER

You have been placed on **REPORTING PROBATION** by the Jackson County Municipal Court for a period of up to five (5) years. You are required to report to the Probation Department *immediately upon leaving the courtroom today*, and the first week of each month throughout your term of probation unless otherwise notified in writing by your Probation Officer, the deputy Chief of Probation, the Chief Bailiff or the Judge. During any period of incarceration in any detention facility, your probation time will be tolled, not terminated, and you will be required to report to the Probation Department within 72 hours of your release. Release from probation requires a written order from the Judge of this court.

IN ACCORDANCE WITH R.C. § 2951.02(A):

During the period of a misdemeanor offender's community control sanction authorized probation officers may search, with or without a warrant, the person of the offender, the place of residence of the offender, motor vehicles, and other items of tangible or intangible personal property, or other real property in which the offender has a right, title or interest or for which the offender has the express or implied permission of a person with a right, title or interest to use, occupy, or possess if the probation officers have reasonable suspicion to believe that the offender is not abiding by the law or otherwise is not complying with the conditions of the misdemeanor offender's community control sanction. Searchable property owned or possessed by the probationer includes but is not limited to cell phones, cameras, computers, or any other device containing electronic media.

Failure to report to the Probation Department immediately following your court appearance will result in the issuance of a warrant for your immediate arrest.

COMMUNITY SERVICE ORDER

On 12/01/2020 the defendant appeared in court for sentencing. The defendant was ordered to complete 80 hours of community service as a condition of probation. The defendant is **required** to report to the Probation Department, immediately upon leaving the courtroom, or release from custody, whichever comes first, but no later than 72 hours after said release or court appearance. The defendant will meet with Probation Staff to make arrangements for the completion of community service.

The defendant is required to begin community service within seven (7) days of sentencing, or release from incarceration and complete a **minimum** of **24** hours of community service per week until all hours are completed.

Community Service hours must be completed per the following schedule, unless an exception is granted by the Community Service Director, in writing:

It is the sole responsibility of the defendant to make such request in writing. The process for requesting relief from community service is outlined in the probation contract.






