On May 11, 2024, Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation (BCI) Special Agent (SA) Sarah Taylor was assigned to assist with an Officer Involved Critical Incident. The Columbus Police Department (CPD) was dispatched to the area of 4738 McAllister Avenue for reports of an active domestic assault with shots fired. Multiple witnesses reported Corey Roach (Roach) was actively assaulting his girlfriend, Nicole Pleasant (Pleasant) before he shot and killed her. Upon CPD officers' arrival, they observed Roach with a rifle. After verbal commands were given, Roach discharged his rifle at the CPD officers. CPD [REDACTED] returned fire as he sought cover from Roach shooting towards him. Roach was struck by gunfire and transported to Mount Carmel where he was pronounced deceased.

SA Taylor reported to the CPD substation located at [REDACTED] Columbus, Ohio to photograph and collect Officer [REDACTED] firearm. SA Taylor arrived on scene and waited for [REDACTED] to report back to the substation. At 1024 hours, SA Taylor photographed [REDACTED] as he was upon arrival. [REDACTED] was wearing a dark blue uniform shirt and pants with a black bullet proof vest. The vest had [REDACTED] name and unit number [REDACTED] as well as a Columbus Police badge. He did not have any apparent injuries; however, he did have suspected dirt on the bottom of his pant leg.

[REDACTED] had a Smith & Wesson, 9 M&P semi-automatic handgun (serial number: [REDACTED]) with a TLR-1 Streamlight attached and one cartridge in the chamber. [REDACTED] provided SA Taylor with the magazine that was inserted in his firearm during the shooting. The magazine contained eight cartridges. [REDACTED] provided three additional magazines that were fully loaded. SA Taylor collected the handgun, the cartridge in the chamber, and the magazine with eight cartridges as item 1.

SA Taylor was informed that Officer [REDACTED] witnessed the incident; however, did not discharge his firearm. SA Taylor took photographs of Officer [REDACTED] and his service weapon. Officer [REDACTED] was wearing a dark blue uniform shirt and pants with his last name on his shirt as well as a Columbus Police badge. In his holster was a Smith & Wesson, 9 M&P semi-automatic handgun (serial number: [REDACTED]) with a TLR-1 Streamlight attached. The handgun had one cartridge in the

chamber and a fully loaded magazine. Officer [REDACTED] provided three additional magazines he carried, which were fully loaded.

SA Taylor reported to Scene 1 where she transferred evidence from Scene 2 to SA Aja Chung on May 12, 2024, at 0234 hours.
