Narrative:

On Tuesday, November 14, 2023, Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation (BCI) Special Agent (SA) Chad Holcomb (SA Holcomb) received training and personnel file records from Columbus Division of Police (CPD) Sergeant Terry McConnell for Lieutenant SA Holcomb reviewed the training and personnel file records and noted the following:

Use of Force History:

Prior to the incident on July 6, 2023, Lt. had no records of "Outside Policy" use of force incidents in his personnel file. There were no indications that Lt. had been disciplined for his use of force.

Internal Investigation:

Lt. was found to have a "Sustained" disposition on a on-duty citizen complaint on January 24, 2019. No details were provided regarding the investigation.
