Narrative:

On October 1, 2023, the Washington Court House Police Department requested the assistance of the Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation (BCI), to investigate the facts and circumstances surrounding an Officer-Involved Critical Incident (OICI) involving a use of force incident with a taser. The involved subject, Timothy West (West), was the passenger in a vehicle, who fled on foot from a traffic stop. During the foot pursuit, West ran onto a concrete patio, then turned and ran toward the officer, and the officer deployed his taser. West became unresponsive and was ultimately pronounced deceased.

On October 1, 2023, BCI Special Agents Lauren Frazier and Steven Seitzman conducted a neighborhood canvass of the immediate area surrounding 415 Gregg Street, Washington Court House, OH. Below is a summary of the canvass conducted.

401 Gregg Street –

- Agents spoke to the homeowner, who refused to give his name or contact information. He stated he did not hear or see anything. Agents also spoke to the homeowner's daughter via Ring doorbell.
- Residence had Ring video doorbell but homeowners stated there was no video of the incident that was recorded.

407 Gregg Street –

- Agents spoke to the homeowner, Krystin Kreps ([REDACTED]).
- Homeowner advised nothing was heard or seen but her dogs started barking around the time of the incident.

410 Gregg Street –

- Agents spoke to the homeowners, Jim Mayfield ([REDACTED]) and Miranda Eggleton.

- Homeowners left their house right before the incident occurred. When they arrived home, they noticed a police presence, but did not know what happened.

415 Gregg Street –

- Agents spoke to the homeowners, Heather DeLarosa ([REDACTED]) and Jackie Tackett-DeLarosa ([REDACTED]).
- Homeowners were inside when the incident occurred and recalled hearing things, possibly a woman screaming, but never went outside to check it out. Later, they heard an ambulance but also didn't go outside.
- Officers knocked on the door, when they were told that something had happened in their side yard and requested them not to go near the area.
- Homeowner's son also home during the incident – didn't hear or see anything – Brad Card ([REDACTED]).
- Homeowners have cameras but they were not recording at the time of the incident.
- Agents obtained a signed consent to search form (see attachment #01).

A copy of the audio recorded neighborhood canvasses are attached (attachments #02-04). The interview at 407 Gregg Street was not recorded due to the homeowner's making contact with agents and inability to initiate a recording.
