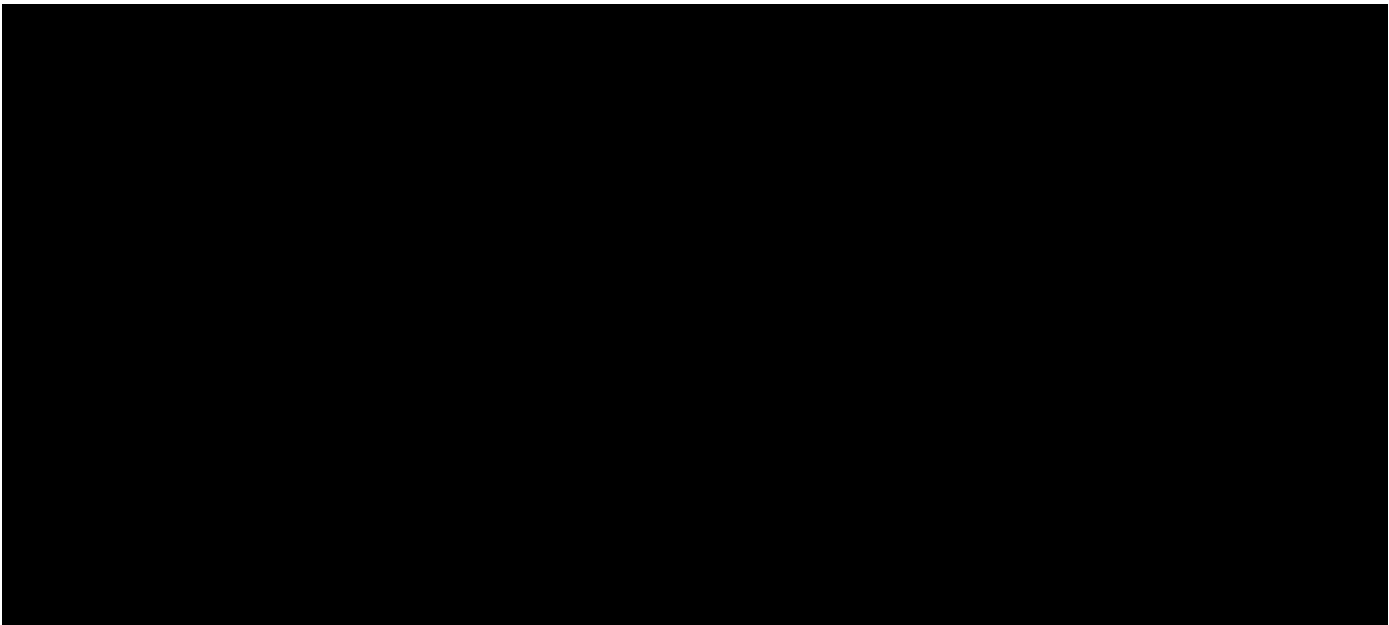

Narrative:

On May 17, 2024 and May 20, 2024, Bureau of Criminal Investigation (BCI) Special Agent Kyle Douglass (SA Douglass) received copies of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives (ATF) Firearms eTrace Reports and NIBIN Reports. These reports were completed by ATF following and Officer Involved Critical Incident (OICI) which occurred on May 13, 2024 at 4738 McAllister Avenue in Columbus, OH. BCI was requested for assistance by the Columbus Division of Police (CPD) after officers responded to a domestic disturbance involving Corey Roach (Roach). During the encounter, Roach allegedly discharged a firearm at responding CPD officers, and one CPD officer reportedly returned fire, striking Roach. Roach was transported to Mt. Carmel Hospital where he was pronounced deceased. BCI Crime Scene Unit (CSU) recovered several firearms from the scene of the incident which reportedly did not belong to any law enforcement officers on scene.

SA Douglass reviewed ATF eTrace reports and NIBIN reports received for firearms recovered from the aforementioned incident.
