Narrative:

On June 15, 2021, at the Cuyahoga County Medical Examiner's Office, Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation (BCI), Special Agent (SA) Arvin Clar (Clar) attended the Post Mortem/Autopsy of Kevin Giesel.

The autopsy began at 1000 hours and was conducted by Doctor David Dolinak (Dr. Dolinak).

The deceased had two wounds (believed to be gunshot wounds) to the upper center chest.

There were two wounds in the upper back of the deceased believed to be the exit wounds.

The x-rays performed on the deceased revealed small partial metal fragments but no bullets observed.

Upon examination of the internal organs of the deceased, the top portion of the heart was observed to have been severely damaged by the gunshot wounds.

The deceased person's liver also appeared to have suffered damage from the path of the bullets.

Upon closer examination of the entrance wounds, Dr. Dolinak reported that the two entrance wounds in the upper chest were approximately one eighth of an inch apart.

Dr. Dolinak also reported that no bruising was observed around the deceased's wrists or ankles.

Dr. Dolinak believes, in his preliminary examination, the trauma and damage to the deceased person's heart was the causative factor of death.
