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APPROVAL—LEASE TO RESERVOIR LAND IN BUCKEYE LAKE, FAIRFIELD COUNTY, OHIO—JOSEPHINE KIENLE.

COLUMBUS, OHIO, April 2, 1936.

HON. L. WOODDELL, *Conservation Commissioner, Columbus, Ohio.*

DEAR SIR: This is to acknowledge the receipt of a recent communication over the signature of the Chief of the Bureau of Inland Lakes and Parks with which there is submitted for my examination and approval a reservoir land lease in triplicate which has been executed by you as Conservation Commissioner to one Josephine Kienle of Columbus, Ohio. By this lease, which is one for a stated term of fifteen years and which provides for an annual rental of eighteen dollars, payable in semi-annual installments of nine dollars each, there is leased and demised to the lessee above named the right to occupy and use for cottage site purposes the inner slope and waterfront and the outer slope and borrow pit that is included in the north half of Embankment Lot No. 46 south of Lakeside on the westerly embankment of Buckeye Lake as laid out by the Canal Commission in 1905, being part of the Northwest Quarter of Section 28, Township 17, Range 18, Fairfield County, Ohio.

It appears further in this connection that this lease is a renewal of a lease of the above described parcel of land which was originally granted to one Daniel Coons under date of April 19, 1920, and which by proper transfer is now owned and held by the above named grantee in this lease.

Upon examination of this lease, I find that the same has been properly executed by you as Conservation Commissioner for and in the name of the state of Ohio and by Josephine Kienle, the lessee above named. I further find, upon examination of the provisions of this lease and of the conditions and restrictions therein contained, that the same are in conformity with Section 471 and other sections of the General Code relating to leases of this kind. I am accordingly approving this lease as to legality and form as is evidenced by my approval endorsed upon the lease and upon the duplicate and triplicate copies thereof, all of which are herewith returned.
