DISAPPROVAL—ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF THE LOYAL ASSOCIATION OF TOLEDO.

COLUMBUS, OHIO, December 3, 1936.

HON. GEORGE S. MYERS, Secretary of State, Columbus, Ohio.

DEAR SIR: I have examined the articles of incorporation of The Loyal Association of Toledo. It is sought to form this corporation not for profit under the General Corporation Act of Ohio.

The purpose of the corporation is set forth as follows:

"To assist and provide relief for the members of the association in sickness or distress during their lifetime or in interment after death; to aid generally in providing relief and promoting the welfare of non-members in the City of Toledo, Ohio who may be in need thereof; to acquire by purchase, lease or otherwise real and personal property; to own, improve and hold and to dispose of said property when it may so suit the discretion of the association and to do any and all other things necessary and incidental to the carrying out of the foregoing purposes."

There is nothing in the articles of incorporation that would show that this corporation is exempt from the insurance laws of the state of Ohio. I am therefore returning the same to you without my approval.
