APPROVAL, CONTRACT BY AND BETWEEN THE VILLAGE OF SOMERSET, OHIO, AND THE STATE OF OHIO FOR THE RECONSTRUCTION OF THE EXISTING SEPARATE CROSSING OF THE TRACKS OF THE B. & O. R. R. AND HIGHWAY NO. 356.

DEAR SIR: You have submitted for my approval a contract by and between the Village of Somerset, Ohio, acting by its counsel, and the State of Ohio acting by the Director of Highways, providing for the reconstruction of the existing separated crossing over the tracks of the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad Company and State Highway No. 356, located in the Village of Somerset in Perry County, Ohio.

You have also submitted the certificate of the clerk of the Village of Somerset, Ohio that the money required for payment of the cost thereof is in the treasury to the credit of the State and Village Road Improvement Fund and not appropriated for any other purpose and that the contract has been duly entered into and is recorded on the journal of said village.

You have also submitted the certificate of the Auditor of the Department of Highways of the State of Ohio that the sum of Thirty-three Thousand (\$33,000.00) Dollars is deposited in the State Treasury of the State of Ohio and is an advance of Federal funds and is charged against an appropriation made to the Bureau of Public Roads of the United States Department of Agriculture and that said funds are not otherwise encumbered.

Finding said contract in proper legal form, I have endorsed my approval thereon and return the same herewith to you, together with other papers submitted in this connection.
