TO ADOPT SECTION 5a, ARTICLE XIII, CONSTITUTION—TO
PROHIBIT EXPENDITURE OF MONEYS DERIVED FROM CER-
TAIN TAXES RELATING TO VEHICLES FOR OTHER THAN
HIGHWAY AND RELATED PURPOSES.

Dear Sir:

You have submitted for my examination a written petition bearing over one hundred names, containing a proposed constitutional amendment and a summary of the same under Section 4785-175, General Code.
