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APPROVAL—CONTRACT BETWEEN VILLAGE OF WOODVILLE AND STATE OF OHIO FOR IMPROVEMENT OF PORTION OF FREMONT-PERRYSBURG ROAD, STATE HIGHWAY NO. 275, APPORTIONED SHARE OF COST OF IMPROVEMENT TO BE PAID BY EACH OF PARTIES THERETO.

DEAR SIR: You have submitted for my approval as to form and legality a contract in duplicate by and between the Village of Woodville and the State of Ohio providing for the improvement of a portion of the Fremont-Perrysburg Road, State Highway No. 275, in the Village of Woodville, Ohio and setting forth the apportioned share of the cost and expense of said improvement to be paid by said parties. Attached thereto is a certificate of the Auditor of the Department of Highways and the Director of Finance certifying that there are sufficient funds in the appropriation to the Department of Highways not otherwise obligated and thereby set aside to pay the State's share of the cost of the proposed improvement.

There is also attached the certificate of the Clerk of the Village of Woodville certifying that the money for the payment of the cost of the improvement, other than that part assumed by the State, is in the treasury of said village or in the process of collection, and not appropriated for any other purpose or as being obtained by the sale of bonds, which bonds are sold and in the process of delivery.

Upon careful examination, it is my opinion that said contract is in proper legal form and constitutes a binding contract by and between the parties thereto for the purposes therein stated.

I have, therefore, endorsed my approval thereon as to form and legality as is provided by law, and am returning the same herewith.
