Narrative:

On May 2, 2024, Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation (BCI) Special Agent Chad Holcomb (SA Holcomb) had a meeting with Special Prosecutions Unit from the Ohio Attorney General's Office regarding the investigation. AG Special Prosecutions have been asked by the Lawrence County Prosecutors Office to handle the investigation.

During the meeting, Senior Assistant AG Erik Spitzer and Senior Assistant AG Bill Walton asked SA Holcomb to have Skylar Corbin's toxicology run from his autopsy. SA Holcomb called the Lawrence County Coroner's Office Chief Investigator Drew Artis and asked for the toxicology to be processed.

Inv. Artis stated that since the body of Corbin was moved from a hospital in West Virginia to the Montgomery County Coroner's Office for an autopsy, the hospital did not provide an admission blood standard of Corbin. Due to this, SA Holcomb was informed that any blood that was collected from autopsy would not necessarily be accurate due to the medications that Corbin was provided at the hospital and the timeframe between the shooting and his death.

Inv. Artis helped SA Holcomb find the toxicology results in Corbin's medical records. The toxicology results can be found on page 502. The specimen collection was on January 9, 2024 at 2309 hours.
