LEASE—OFFICE SPACE—STATE WITH THE BROTHERHOOD OF RAILWAY AND STEAMSHIP CLERKS, ET. AL., BUILDING COMPANY, ROOMS 502 AND 504, BROTHERHOOD OF RAILWAY CLERKS BUILDING, COURT AND VINE STREETS, CINCINNATI, USE, SALES TAX, TAX COMMISSION OF OHIO.

DEAR SIR: You have submitted for my examination and approval a certain lease executed by The Brotherhood of Railway and Steamship Clerks, Freight Handlers, Express and Station Employes Building Company of Cincinnati, Ohio, in and by which there are leased and demised
