On July 14<sup>th</sup>, 2022, Special Agent (SA) Kevin Wagner with the Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation (BCI) responded to the Montgomery County Coroner's Office to take custody of autopsy evidence regarding a Clearcreek Township officer involved critical incident. Clearcreek Township Police responded to a domestic dispute between suspect Mark Evers (Evers) and his wife. While there, Evers reportedly opened fire on Clearcreek Township Officer Eric Ney, striking him in the face. Sergeant Nicole Cordero, returned fire at Evers striking him multiple times. Evers was pronounced deceased at the scene. Evers was transported to the Montgomery County Coroner's Office for an autopsy.

SA Wagner took custody of the autopsy evidence, which consisted of; a blood card (item 1), fingerprints/hair samples and \$.50 (item 2), four fired bullets (item 3), handcuffs (item 4), pair of gray slip on shoes/socks (item 5), and a black shirt, blue jeans and underwear (item 6). All items were retrieved from Evers' body during the autopsy.

SA Wagner took the items to BCI where the four fired bullets (item 4) were submitted to the lab for comparison. The remainder of the evidence was submitted to the evidence lockers so they could be submitted into BCI's major crimes evidence vault.
