CONTRACT—STATE WITH GEORGE W. WING, WORTHINGTON, ELECTRICAL WORK, MEN'S DORMITORY, BOWLING GREEN STATE UNIVERSITY, BOWLING GREEN.

COLUMBUS, OHIO, April 10, 1939.

DEAR SIR: You have submitted for my approval a contract by and between George W. Wing, an individual doing business as Wing Electric Company, of Worthington, Ohio, and the State of Ohio, acting through you as Director of the Department of Public Works for the Board of Trustees of Bowling Green State University, Bowling Green, Ohio, for Contract for Electrical Work for a project known as Men's Dormitory, Bowling Green State University, Bowling Green, Ohio, as set forth in Item 4, Electrical Contract for Men's Dormitory, of the Form of Proposal dated November 28, 1938, all according to Plans and Specifications, which Plans, Specifications and Proposal are made a part of this Contract, the contract calling for an expenditure of \$6,062.00.

Finding said bond in proper legal form, I have noted my approval thereon, and am returning same herewith together with all documents and papers submitted in this connection.
