On March 19, 2025, the Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation (BCI) was requested by the Lockland Police Department (LPD) to investigate an officer involved critical incident. As part of the investigation, Crime Scene Technician (CST) Holly Ryczek responded to the Lockland Police Department, 101 North Cooper Avenue, Lockland, OH 45215, to process the involved officer.

CST Ryczek arrived at the station at approximately 0519 hours. She was advised that one LPD officer had discharged his weapon and a taser. The officer located at the station was observed to be in his agency issued uniform and advised he was dressed as he was at the time of the incident. The specifics of the officer are detailed below:

•	- LPD: Reportedly discharged his duty pistol and taser
	during the incident. His duty pistol was a Glock 17 9mm pistol (S/N:
	It was found with one cartridge in the chamber and a seated magazine
	containing 12 cartridges. Three additional 9mm magazines were located on his
	duty vest, each containing 17 cartridges. The additional magazines were
	returned to after they were documented. An empty taser holster
	was observed on the front of his duty vest. His pistol, seated magazine, and
	cartridges were collected as item #1.

No further action was taken regarding the involved officer.

CST Ryczek cleared from the station at approximately 0600 hours and returned to Scene #1.

CST Ryczek transferred all items of evidence from law enforcement (Scene #2) to CST Amy Cruey at 0752 hours. CST Ryczek then cleared from Scene #1 at 0830 hours.
