Dear Sir:—You have submitted for my approval a contract by and between The Ohio State Construction Company, Columbus, Ohio, and the State of Ohio, acting by and through Emil F. Marx, Adjutant General and Director of State Armories, for the construction and completion of all branches of the work, except the mechanical trades required in the erection and completion of an Ohio State Theatre, to be erected at Camp Perry, Ohio, which contract calls for the expenditure of fifty-seven thousand six hundred and forty-six dollars (\$57,646.00). There is also contained an extra work order in the amount of \$1.00, together with the encumbrance record number 11 showing its proper appropriation.

Finding said contract and bond in proper legal form, I have this day noted my approval thereon and return the same herewith to you, together with all other documents submitted in this connection.
