



cruiser initiating the stop. Ali continued firing shots toward officers while attempting to flee the area on foot. Ali was fired upon by several officers during the above sequence of events and fell to the ground in a grassy area near the above referenced intersection. [REDACTED] was shot in the upper chest area by Ali's initial shot, however the round impacted [REDACTED]'s vest without penetrating. Ali was transported to Doctor's West Hospital where he was pronounced deceased.

As a part of the above investigation, the Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation (BCI) was provided with a large amount of video evidence capturing the incident. The incident is captured on several body worn cameras (BWC) and cruiser cameras. There is a large amount of BWC and cruiser camera footage of officers not directly involved in the incident which was also included. This footage has been reviewed by BCI but will not be detailed in this report.

The following officers were present during the shooting and either fired their weapon or eye witnessed the incident:

All of the above officers' actions during the shooting are captured on BWC or cruiser camera. MCSO [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] were not equipped with BWCs during the incident, however their actions can still be observed on other officers' BWCs and cruiser cameras.

**CPD [REDACTED]**

[REDACTED] was equipped with a BWC and was operating CPD cruiser [REDACTED] as the driver. [REDACTED]'s BWC is approximately 19 minutes and 39 seconds. The footage begins with [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] on an unrelated call for service.

2 minutes 55 seconds– Radio traffic indicates Madison County is requesting assistance with an active shooter. The two officers immediately indicate they will be responding as soon as possible.

3 minutes 20 seconds– [REDACTED] [REDACTED] indicates the address to respond to 5228 Deignese Place. [REDACTED] [REDACTED] initiates an emergency response.

3 minutes 30 seconds– Dispatch indicates the involved vehicle in a white Toyota traveling eastbound on Hall Road. Dispatch follows up a few seconds later confirming the vehicle left the residence and reiterates it is traveling eastbound on Hall Road.

4 minutes 3 seconds– Dispatch relays the involved vehicle with a registration of HNH 3078.

4 minutes 13 seconds– Dispatch updates responding units the dispatch is in reference to Madison County encountering an active shooter.

5 minutes 5 seconds– CPD supervisor requests dispatch to ask Madison County if they require help at the scene of the shooting or with apprehension of the involved subject. Dispatch responds the officers are ok, but they need help "getting the active shooter stopped."

6 minutes 21 seconds– Dispatch updates the vehicle is traveling northbound on Georgesville Road.

6 minutes 57 seconds– Dispatch updates the vehicle is signaling to turn northbound on Georgesville Road from Hall Road.

7 minutes 19 seconds– [REDACTED] [REDACTED] indicates he has located the vehicle. He completes what appears to be a U–turn by cutting the wheel hard to the left.

7 minutes 25 seconds– [REDACTED] [REDACTED] airs radio traffic "[REDACTED] we're behind it now."

7 minutes 28 seconds– [REDACTED] [REDACTED] asks [REDACTED] [REDACTED] "JNJ." [REDACTED] [REDACTED] responds "no HNH."

7 minutes 36 seconds– [REDACTED] [REDACTED] states "there they are there they are."

7 minutes 38 seconds– Gunfire can be heard and [REDACTED] [REDACTED] yells out "Ugh" as he is exiting the vehicle.

7 minutes 40 seconds– [REDACTED] [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] both can be observed at the rear of cruiser [REDACTED] with sustained gunfire being audibly observed. [REDACTED] [REDACTED] draws his firearm and fires the entire magazine at a Black male in black clothing (later identified as Ali) fleeing the area. [REDACTED] [REDACTED] moved in an arch from southbound to northbound and ultimately came to a stop near [REDACTED] of [REDACTED] [REDACTED]

██████████ when he stopped firing. ██████████ ██████████ can be observed exiting ██████████ at this time, however this is the only time he is observed during the shooting on this BWC.

7 minutes 47 seconds– ██████████ ██████████ yells out "I'm hit" as he performs a reload of his handgun. The driver's side window of CPD cruiser ██████████ is shot out and shattered on the ground.

7 minutes 49 seconds– ██████████ ██████████ airs radio traffic indicating an officer has been hit and the involved subject is down. Dispatch asks if the officer is hit by a car or a bullet to which ██████████ ██████████ confirms he has been struck by a bullet.

7 minutes 59 seconds– Three uniformed officers, ██████████, ██████████ ██████████, and ██████████ ██████████, can be observed approaching Ali with their guns drawn yelling commands to show his hands.

8 minutes 11 seconds– ██████████ ██████████ approaches ██████████ ██████████ asking if he is ok. ██████████ ██████████ replies he has been hit, but thinks he was hit in the vest.

8 minutes 15 seconds– A large amount of officers have moved up and covered Ali as ██████████ ██████████ removes himself from the immediate area to begin assessing his wound.

8 minutes 42 seconds– ██████████ ██████████ indicates he does not believe he is bleeding, but is instructed to go to the hospital by multiple CPD officers.

9 minutes 12 seconds– ██████████ ██████████ (now as the driver) and ██████████ appear to get into CPD cruiser 154 and begin an emergency response self transport to Grant Medical Center. *Cruiser 154's cruiser camera was also reviewed and confirmed this information, therefore there will not be a separate report for 154's footage review. To avoid redundancy, this portion of ██████████ ██████████'s BWC will not be documented separately as it contains the same information as ██████████ ██████████'s.*

10 minutes 14 seconds– ██████████ ██████████ indicates the bullet hit his "tin pin" as he continues to assess where he was shot.

11 minutes 7 seconds– ██████████ ██████████ can be heard explaining the vehicle tag they received from dispatch was incorrect. ██████████ ██████████ reiterates this several seconds later to which ██████████ ██████████ responds by describing seeing the ██████████ coming up. ██████████ ██████████ confirms she observed the same which confirmed her belief they were behind the right vehicle.

12 minutes 31 seconds– ██████████ ██████████ indicates the round that impacted him came through the windshield.

12 minutes 49 seconds– [REDACTED] [REDACTED] indicates his shoulder is beginning to hurt.

14 minutes 21 seconds– [REDACTED] [REDACTED] reiterates his shoulder is hurting.

18 minutes 58 seconds– [REDACTED] [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] arrive at Grant.

The BWC is discontinued at 19 minutes 39 seconds with the timestamp on the video indicating it is approximately 1825 hours.

#### *CPD Cruiser [REDACTED] Camera (front dash)*

The video provided to BCI for CPD Cruiser [REDACTED] is approximately three (3) hours and 37 minutes in length with the vast majority of the information contained being coming after the shooting while the vehicle remained on scene. The radio traffic during the response referenced from the above synopsis of CPD [REDACTED] [REDACTED]'s BWC will not be repeated with the exception of the initial dispatch.

1 minute 26 seconds– Initial dispatch comes out with the same information as above. Emergency response is initiated.

5 minutes 49 seconds– [REDACTED] [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] turned southbound on Georgesville Road from Clime Road.

5 minutes 53 seconds– [REDACTED] [REDACTED] indicates he can see the white Toyota which can be observed traveling northbound on Georgesville Road. [REDACTED] [REDACTED] completes a U–turn and positions the vehicle behind the white Toyota while [REDACTED] [REDACTED] radios they are behind the vehicle.

6 minutes 5 seconds– The white Toyota comes to a stop at the intersection of Georgesville Road and Clime Road. Simultaneously CPD cruiser [REDACTED] (occupied by [REDACTED] [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]) come through the same intersection off of Clime Road, while two FTPD cruisers ([REDACTED] [REDACTED], [REDACTED] [REDACTED], and [REDACTED] [REDACTED]) approach the white Toyota head on.

6 minutes 10 seconds– Ali exits the driver's side of the white Toyota, assumes a two handed firing stance and fires a round through the driver's side windshield of CPD [REDACTED] (glass breakage observed). Ali begins to flee the vehicle towards a grassy area near the above intersection while continuing to fire in the direction of the initial responding officers. Ali changed his grip to a one handed grip and was firing behind him as he was running away.

6 minutes 19 seconds– Ali falls to the ground where he remains motionless, until he is ultimately transported from the scene via squad approximately 9 minutes later.

During the above series of events, [REDACTED] [REDACTED] can be observed firing through the [REDACTED] [REDACTED], [REDACTED] [REDACTED] can be observed firing

from a position near his driver's side cruiser door, and [REDACTED] [REDACTED] can be observed firing from a position near his driver's side cruiser door. All shooting appears to discontinue at approximately 6 minutes 20 seconds.

6 minutes 20 seconds– [REDACTED] [REDACTED] announces he has been hit.

6 minutes 20–50 seconds– A large number of officers approach Ali and additional CPD cruisers begin arriving on scene. [REDACTED] [REDACTED] can be seen beginning to access the extent of his injuries.

7 minutes 18 seconds– CPD Officer Ryan Mauck can be observed instructing [REDACTED] [REDACTED] to go to the hospital.

Officers have begun rendering aid to Ali at this point in time as well as establishing a crime scene perimeter.

The remaining footage shows a large response to the area from multiple law enforcement agencies.

*CPD [REDACTED] [REDACTED]*

[REDACTED] [REDACTED] was equipped with an activated BWC during the incident which is approximately 21 minutes and 23 seconds. The information contained on [REDACTED] [REDACTED]'s BWC is the same as above on [REDACTED] [REDACTED]'s BWC and CPD cruiser [REDACTED]'s dash cam until she exits the cruiser at the start of the shooting. The review of footage unique [REDACTED] [REDACTED]'s BWC will be detailed below.

8 minutes 43 seconds– [REDACTED] [REDACTED] states "there they are, there they are."

8 minutes 44 seconds– Gunfire can be heard. [REDACTED] [REDACTED] exits the cruiser and moves to the rear of cruiser [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] [REDACTED] can be observed pulling up on the [REDACTED] [REDACTED] with the driver's door ajar. [REDACTED] [REDACTED] radios "shots fired" as multiple additional gunshots can be heard. [REDACTED] [REDACTED] can be observed with his firearm drawn and presented in his eyeline while positioned near the driver's side rear of cruiser [REDACTED].

8 minutes 47 seconds– [REDACTED] [REDACTED] can be observed firing his firearm.

8 minutes 48 seconds– [REDACTED] [REDACTED] can be observed raising her firearm in the direction of Ali. Ali is running towards the grassy area near the intersection of Georgesville and Clime Road with his firearm in his right hand raised towards [REDACTED] [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] location. [REDACTED] [REDACTED] fires at least one round in Ali's direction before ducking back behind cruiser [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] [REDACTED] can be observed firing at least one round from his firearm at this time.

8 minutes 48–54 seconds– Sustained gunfire can be heard only while [REDACTED] [REDACTED] is

behind cruiser [REDACTED].

8 minutes 55 seconds– [REDACTED] announces he is hit, which [REDACTED] [REDACTED] over the radio.

[REDACTED] [REDACTED] initially approaches the now downed Ali with several other officers on scene before getting into cruiser 154 (driver) with [REDACTED] [REDACTED] and transporting him to Grant Medical Center. The information for this point forward is the same as noted above in [REDACTED] [REDACTED] BWC review. The footage concludes when the two arrive at Grant Medical Center.

CPD [REDACTED] [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] [REDACTED] was equipped with an activated BWC during the incident which is approximately 14 minutes and 19 seconds in length. [REDACTED] [REDACTED] was operating CPD cruiser [REDACTED] as the driver and was working with [REDACTED] [REDACTED]. The footage begins with [REDACTED] [REDACTED] and Officer [REDACTED] on an unrelated call for service when they receive the same dispatch as the above officers. The radio traffic the two officers receive during their response is the same as the above officers.

1 minute 58 seconds– the two officers initiate an emergency response.

5 minutes 51 seconds– [REDACTED] [REDACTED] radios traffic "[REDACTED] we're behind it now."

6 minutes 2 seconds– [REDACTED] [REDACTED] completes a U–turn and as he is coming to a stop behind [REDACTED] [REDACTED] and [REDACTED], gunfire can be heard and [REDACTED] [REDACTED] yells "Oh shit."

6 minutes 6 seconds– As [REDACTED] exits the vehicle sustained gunfire can be heard and [REDACTED] [REDACTED] can be observed in a firing stance near the driver's side of cruiser [REDACTED] and the [REDACTED] of [REDACTED] [REDACTED]. Broken glass can be observed on the ground near the driver's side of cruiser [REDACTED] along with the driver's side window being broken. Officer [REDACTED] can be observed at the rear of cruiser [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] [REDACTED] can be observed at the [REDACTED] [REDACTED]. Ali can be observed fleeing in a grassy area near the intersection of Clime and Georgesville Road. [REDACTED] [REDACTED] appears to fire multiple rounds in the direction of Ali as he is fleeing.

6 minutes 6–12 seconds– Gunfire ceases as Ali falls to the ground in the above described area. [REDACTED] [REDACTED] can be heard announcing he has been hit at the conclusion of the gunfire. [REDACTED] [REDACTED] moves to the rear of [REDACTED] [REDACTED] [REDACTED] with several other officers before ultimately moving up to access Ali several seconds later.

[REDACTED] [REDACTED] participates in securing Ali as well as the rendering aid process. [REDACTED]

██████████ and ██████████ can be observed assisting with this process. Ali appears to have sustained gunshot wounds to the torso and neck and does not make any statements during the process.

13 minutes 23 seconds– ██████████ ██████████ can be heard explaining to an unknown officer that Ali parked the vehicle at its current location, exited, began shooting at officers, and ran to the current location.

14 minutes 13 seconds– ██████████ ██████████ identifies himself as an involved officer and an officer support officer instructs him to turn off his BWC.

14 minutes 19 seconds– ██████████ ██████████ discontinues his BWC.

#### *CPD Cruiser ██████████ cruiser camera*

CPD cruiser ██████████ has equipped with an activated cruiser camera throughout the incident. The footage is approximately 3 hours 36 minutes and 29 seconds in length with the vast majority of the information contained coming after the incident concluded. The footage begins with ██████████ ██████████ and Officer on an unrelated call for service when they receive the same dispatch as the above officers. The radio traffic the two officers receive during their response is the same as the above officers.

1 minute 58 seconds– the two officers initiate an emergency response.

5 minutes 52 seconds through 6 minutes 2 seconds– ██████████ ██████████ radios "██████████ we're behind it now." ██████████ ██████████ and ██████████ indicate they see the involved vehicle. ██████████ ██████████ makes a left (southbound) turn on Georgesville Road from Clime Road and positions cruiser ██████████ behind cruiser ██████████. Ali's white Toyota Camry can be observed traveling northbound on Georgesville Road with cruiser ██████████ following closely behind with emergency equipment activated. ██████████ ██████████ ██████████ and ██████████ ██████████ can also be observed pulling up beside cruiser ██████████.0

6 minutes 2–11 seconds– ██████████ ██████████ yells "Oh shit" as he is parking the cruiser and gunfire can be heard. Ali has exited the driver's side of the white Toyota and is positioned facing cruiser ██████████. ██████████ ██████████ and ██████████ can be observed running from the front of cruiser ██████████ to the rear. Both officers draw their weapons and fire multiple rounds in Ali's direction as he is attempting to flee the area. ██████████ ██████████ can be observed exiting the driver's seat of the ██████████ and fire multiple rounds in Ali's direction. ██████████ ██████████ appears to fire through the windshield of ██████████ while he remained seated in the driver's seat. As the above officers are firing, Ali is attempting to flee the area with a handgun pointed back in the direction of the officers. Ali exits the video footage and appears to go to the ground, which is visually obstructed by ██████████ ██████████ All shooting discontinues at approximately 6 minutes 11 seconds.

6 minutes 13 seconds- [REDACTED] [REDACTED] announces "I'm hit" as he performs a magazine exchange.

The remaining footage is a distant view of of officers detaining Ali and appearing to render aid prior to Ali being transported from the scene by EMS. A crime scene is quickly established with crime scene tape as well as intersections being closed down by additional responding officers.

**CPD [REDACTED]**

[REDACTED] [REDACTED] was equipped with an activated BWC during the incident which is approximately 24 minutes 37 seconds in length. [REDACTED] [REDACTED] was the passenger in CPD cruiser [REDACTED] which was being driven by [REDACTED] [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] [REDACTED] was armed with a shotgun during the incident, however he does not fire the weapon at any time. [REDACTED] [REDACTED]'s BWC footage does not visually capture any of the shooting footage due to vehicles obstructing the view. Sustained gunfire can be heard as [REDACTED] [REDACTED] exited cruiser [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] [REDACTED] approaches Ali with a large number of additional officers and participates in securing Ali as well as rendering aid afterwards. [REDACTED] [REDACTED] is later instructed to be removed from the scene as he would likely be considered as a witnessing officer.

**FTP [REDACTED]**

[REDACTED] was equipped with an activated BWC during the incident which is approximately 7 minutes and 5 seconds in length. [REDACTED]'s footage begins with him driving in emergency response monitoring radio traffic. [REDACTED] appears to be monitoring two radio frequencies with one being the same as the above CPD officers and the other believed to be Franklin County West based off of [REDACTED] witness statement as well as several other officers' statements. The CPD radio essentially repeats the Franklin County West traffic as it provides updates on Ali's location.

1 minute 51 seconds- [REDACTED] radios "[REDACTED] and [REDACTED] are coming up Clime to Georgesville."

2 minutes 54 seconds- [REDACTED] [REDACTED] radios "[REDACTED] we're behind it now."

3 minutes through 3 minutes 6 seconds- [REDACTED] parks near the middle of the intersection of Georgesville and Clime Road. [REDACTED] exits the vehicle and draws his firearm, sustained gunfire can be heard. [REDACTED] appears to fire multiple rounds in the direction of Ali as he is attempting to flee the area. Ali can be observed falling to the ground in a grassy area near the above intersection. No shooting occurs after this moment.

[REDACTED] along with several other officers approach Ali. [REDACTED] appears to

secure Ali's firearm (black semi-automatic handgun) and place it on the ground several feet away from Ali and the other officers securing him. [REDACTED] appears to remain standing over/near the firearm until relieved by another officer.

5 minutes 20 seconds- [REDACTED] acknowledges he fired shots during the incident to an uninvolved officer.

6 minutes 38 seconds- [REDACTED] is relieved of watching the firearm.

6 minutes 55 seconds- [REDACTED] is approached by an officer support officer, once again acknowledges he fired shots, and is instructed to turn his BWC off.

7 minutes 4 seconds- BWC footage discontinues.

**FTP** [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] was equipped with an activated BWC during the incident which is approximately 5 minutes and 37 seconds in length. [REDACTED] is the driver and [REDACTED] is the passenger. The radio traffic set up is the same as [REDACTED]. The footage begins with [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] in emergency response and CPD dispatch relaying the vehicles location as "Hall and Georgesville."

48-56 seconds- [REDACTED] parks the cruiser behind [REDACTED] and quickly exits to the sound of sustained gunfire. [REDACTED] cruiser appears to be parked nose to nose with Ali's white Toyota with [REDACTED] crouching behind the open driver's door. [REDACTED] fires multiple times at Ali during this time. [REDACTED] draws his firearm and appears to fire multiple rounds at Ali. Ali can be observed attempting to flee the area before falling to the ground in a grassy area near the intersection of Clime and Georgesville Road. Ali appeared to be fleeing the area with his arm outstretched pointing back towards the CPD cruisers behind him.

[REDACTED], [REDACTED], [REDACTED] and several other officers approach and secure Ali. [REDACTED] secures Ali's firearm while [REDACTED] and other officers begin to assess Ali's injuries and begin rendering aid. Ali appears to have sustained multiple gunshot wounds to the torso and appears unresponsive.

Officer support arrives on scene and orders [REDACTED] to turn off his BWC. The footage is discontinued at 5 minutes and 37 seconds.

**FTP** [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] was equipped with an activated BWC during the incident which is approximately 6 minutes and 6 seconds long. [REDACTED] was the passenger and [REDACTED] was the driver. The footage begins with [REDACTED] retrieving a rifle and securing it in passenger side floorboard area.

24 seconds- [REDACTED] radios "[REDACTED] we're behind it now."

38-46 seconds- The cruiser parks and [REDACTED] exits the passenger side to the sound of sustained gunfire. [REDACTED] chambers a round using the charging handle of his rifle. [REDACTED] appears to fire a single round from the rifle, however the footage is obstructed by the rear of the vehicle and body positioning.

[REDACTED], and [REDACTED] approach Ali along with several other officers and initially secure him before beginning to render aid. [REDACTED] footage from this point forward mirrors [REDACTED] as they were in the same position.

This concludes the video review of the officers present during the shooting incident.
