DEAR SIR:—You have submitted for my approval a contract between the State of Ohio, acting by and through Frank D. Henderson, Adjutant General of Ohio and Director of State Armories, and F. A. Garner, of Lynchburg, Ohio. This contract covers the construction and completion of a State Armory to be erected at Findlay, Ohio, and calls for an expenditure of forty-three thousand two hundred and six (\$43,206.00) dollars.

You have submitted the certificate of the Director of Finance to the effect that there are unencumbered balances legally appropriated in a sum sufficient to cover the obligations of the contract. You have also submitted a certificate from the Controlling Board, signed by the Secretary thereof, that in accordance with Section 12 of House Bill No. 502, 87th General Assembly, said board has properly consented to and approved the expenditure of the moneys appropriated by the 87th General Assembly for the purpose covered by this contract. In addition, you have submitted a contract bond upon which L. W. Dewey and J. M. Garrison appear as surety, sufficient to cover the amount of the contract.

You have further submitted evidence indicating that plans were properly prepared and approved, notice to bidders was properly given, bids tabulated as required by law and the contract duly awarded. Also it appears that the law relating to the workmen's compensation has been complied with.

Finding said contract and bond in proper legal form, I have this day noted my approval thereon and return the same herewith to you, together with all other data submitted in this connection.
