DEAR SIR:—The receipt is acknowledged of your letter of June 11, 1921, transmitting in duplicate for my examination a transcript of proceedings relative to sale to the city of Toledo of certain lands composing a portion of the old channel and embankments of Swan Creek.

I note that the proposed sale is for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of an act of the general assembly of Ohio passed March 21, 1917, and found in 107 O. L. at page 572. I further find that the description as set out in the transcript submitted by you is identical with that set out in the act of the general assembly above indicated.

An examination of the transcript shows that your proceedings have been in accordance with the special act above mentioned; and I therefore give my approval to the proceedings.

I note your request that I join with you in the sale of the lands in question, and I have complied with your request by signing the resolutions for the sale.
