On August 30, 2024, at approximately 1230 hours, Special Agent Supervisor (SAS) Joshua Durst arrived at the Licking County Sheriff's Office to document law enforcement personnel involved in this incident and collect evidence.

SAS Durst met with an an an with the Johnston Police Department, who indicated he was on scene and discharged his pistol during the incident. He was photographed in his standard issued police uniform which he was wearing during the incident.

SAS Durst collected with an affixed TLR Streamlight weapon light. A hollowpoint cartridge was found in the chamber and 13 additional cartridges were found in the magazine (stamped capacity of 17). Upon examination, but not collected, SAS Durst confirmed two spare magazines were fully loaded with 17 cartridges each.

SAS Durst also met with a second a with the Licking County Sheriff's Office, who indicated she had also discharged her pistol during the incident. She was photographed in her standard issued deputy uniform which she was wearing during the incident.
SAS Durst collected pistol as Item 2. It is described as a Glock model 19, 9mm pistol A hollowpoint cartridge was found in the chamber and 14 additional cartridges were found in the magazine (stamped capacity of 15). Upon examination, but not collected, SAS Durst confirmed two spare magazines were fully loaded with 15 cartridges each.

SAS Durst also met with the following deputies who reported they wereon scene at the time of the shooting, but did not discharge their firearms:

Sergeant John Snodgrass was photographed and his pistol inspected. It is described as a Glock 17, 9mm, with serial number The pistol was loaded with one cartridge in the chamber and fiften in the magazine (stamped capacity of 17).

Deputy Nicholas Dewitt was photographed and his pistol inspected. It is descibed as a Glock 9mm pistol with serial number The pistol was loaded with one cartridge in the chamber and fifteen in the magazine (stamped capacity of 15). Deputy Dewitt also adivsed he had removed his rifle from his crusier, but did not shoot it during the incident. Deputy Dewitt advised the rifle was still in his cruiser at the primary scene; it was later documented and inventoried. It is descibed as a Black Rain

Ordinance carbine rifle (S/N: chambered in .223 Rem/5.56mm. The rifle contained one cartridge in the chamber and 24 in the magazine.

SAS Durst released Items 1 and 2 to Special Agent Mathew Austin on scene at approximately 1515 hours.
