These articles recite that the subscribers "desiring to form a corporation not for profit, under the laws of the State of Ohio," etc. Since these articles are formed under special laws and not under the General Corporation Act, I suggest that section 9593, and the following sections of the General Code, be referred to.

In setting forth the property to be insured, these articles do not limit such property to property in this state as required by section 9593.

For the above reasons, I am herewith returning the certificate of incorporation to you without my approval.
