APPROVAL — PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT
AND SUMMARY TO AMEND SECTION 12 OF ARTICLE XII
OF THE CONSTITUTION.

COLUMBUS, OHIO, February 6, 1936.

DEAR SIR: You have submitted for my examination a written petition signed by one hundred qualified electors of this state containing a proposed constitutional amendment and a summary of the same under the provisions of Section 4785-175, General Code. It is proposed to amend the Constitution by the adoption of a new section to be known as Section 12 of Article XII to read as follows:

“At any election at which a bond issue is submitted to the electors of a political subdivision for their approval or disapproval, only such electors who are paying real or personal property taxes shall be qualified to vote on the question of the approval or disapproval of such bond issue.”

The summary of this amendment reads as follows:

“This amendment will provide that at any election at which a bond issue is submitted to the electors of a political subdivision for their approval or disapproval, only such electors who are paying real or personal property taxes shall be qualified to vote on the question of the approval or disapproval of such bond issue.”

I am of the opinion that the foregoing is a fair and truthful statement of the proposed constitutional amendment and accordingly submit for uses provided by law the following certification:

“Pursuant to the duties imposed upon me under the provisions of Section 4785-175, General Code, I hereby certify that the foregoing summary is a fair and truthful statement of the proposed amendment to the Constitution of Ohio by the addition to Article XII thereof of Section 12.
