CONTRACT—STATE WITH THE GINN ELECTRIC COMPANY,
ELECTRICAL CONTRACT, PIPING AND SERVICE IN TUN-
NEL, MEN'S DORMITORY, OHIO STATE UNIVERSITY.

COLUMBUS, OHIO, June 20, 1939.

HON. CARL G. WAHL, *Director, Department of Public Works, Columbus, Ohio.*

DEAR SIR: You have submitted for my approval, a contract between The Ginn Electric Company, an Ohio corporation, with its place of business in Cincinnati, Ohio, and The State of Ohio acting through you as Director of the Department of Public Works for the Board of Trustees of the Ohio State University, Columbus, Ohio, for the construction and completion of Electrical Contract (Division 2, Item XIII) for the Piping and Service in Tunnel for Men's Dormitory on the campus of the Ohio State University, as set forth in the General Conditions and the specifications for same, and as covered by form of proposal dated May 24, 1939. This contract calls for an expenditure of \$4,750.00.

You have submitted the following papers and documents in this connection: Record of official proceedings of the 712th meeting of the Board of Trustees of Ohio State University, in regard to the awarding of this particular contract; Estimate of cost; Division of contract; Notice to bidders; Proof of publication; form of proposal containing the contract bond signed by the Seaboard Surety Company; its power of attorney for the signer of the bond; its certificate of compliance with the laws of Ohio relating to surety companies; tabulation of bids; copy of 1938 opinion No. 3173 of the Attorney General, on the legality of the financing of the project; Workmen's Compensation Certificate showing a compliance by The Ginn Electric Company with the laws of the State of Ohio relating to Workmen's Compensation; Letter from Auditor of State showing all necessary papers are on file in his office.

Finding said contract in proper legal form, I have noted my approval thereon, and same is transmitted to you herewith, together with all other papers and documents submitted in this connection.
