## Narrative:

On December 21, 2022, the Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation (BCI) was requested to investigate the facts and circumstances surrounding an officer-involved critical incident (OICI) that occurred at Sidney Foodtown, located at 1010 Wapakoneta Avenue, Sidney, Ohio (Shelby County). The OICI occurred when Sidney police officers encountered Todd Jordan (Todd), who was armed with a gun inside Sidney Foodtown.

On December 21, 2022, at 1200 hours, Special Agent (SA) Ryan Emahiser interviewed Sidney Foodtown employee Nicole A Kuba (Kuba) at the Sidney Police Department (SPD), located at 234 W. Court Street, Sidney, Ohio. The details below summarize the pertinent portions of the recorded interview. Please refer to the audio recording for additional information.

This report only summarizes the information deemed by the author to be of the most relevance to the investigation and does not purport to contain all questions and answers from the audio recording. Further, this report was placed in a chronology to aid the reader's overall understanding of the information elicited during the interview and may not be reflective of the actual sequencing of questions or responses. It is suggested that the full audio recording be reviewed to clarify any content or contextual questions regarding the information from the audio recording.

Kuba said that she has worked at the store for seven months as a deli clerk. Kuba advised that on the day of the incident she was working in the deli area and she heard gunshots, followed by Annette Wooddell Wooddell) running through the deli area screaming what Kuba thought was, "Fire!". Kuba stated that Wooddell told Kuba to get into the cooler area, and they and other employees stayed in the cooler and blocked the cooler doors. Kuba said that once they were all in the cooler, Wooddell said that Todd was at the store with a gun trying to shoot them, and Dylan Wooddell said that Todd had tried to shoot him in the parking lot. Kuba did hear five or six gunshots after they hid in the cooler, which she assumed was SPD. Shortly after, SPD officers came to the cooler and told them all that it was safe to exit the cooler.

Kuba advised that she has never had any prior dealings with Todd, nor has she ever heard anyone talk about Todd or dealings with Todd. At that time the interview was concluded and Kuba was advised to contact BCI agents should she have any additional information regarding the incident.
