Narrative:

On Monday, March 30, 2026, at 1159 hours, Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation (BCI) Special Agent (SA) Edward Lulla was contacted by SA Larry Hootman in reference to an officer-involved shooting that had just occurred. SA Hootman advised that a Harrison County Sheriff's Deputy exchanged gunfire with a subject during a traffic stop on US 250 in Harrison County. SA Hootman further advised that the subject fled the scene in a vehicle and that neither the deputy nor the subject were believed to have been injured by gunfire. SA Lulla was requested to respond and assist in processing the scene.

While en route to the US 250 crime scene (Scene #1), SA Lulla met with multiple law enforcement units on US 22 near Hopedale. There, SA Lulla learned that the subject who had fled the US 250 shooting scene had been traveling east on US 22 when troopers from the Ohio State Highway Patrol (OSP) were able to disable the vehicle with the use of spike strips. SA Lulla was told that once the subject's vehicle struck the spike strips, it traveled across the grass median into the westbound lanes, being followed by an OSP cruiser. SA Lulla was told that as the subject's vehicle came to a stop, the subject exited the vehicle, and gunshots were exchanged between the subject and a trooper before the subject fled into the wooded area north of US 22.

SA Lulla contacted SA Hootman and advised him of the second scene and that he would remain and process this scene (Scene #2). SA Hootman advised that SA Doran would be en route to assist SA Lulla.

SA Lulla collected photographic documentation of the scene in the condition it was found upon his arrival. Upon the arrival of SA Doran, he documented the scene using a Leica BLK360 scanner.

The two vehicles involved in the incident on US 22 were identified and documented. The subject's vehicle was a 2014 Dodge Journey bearing Ohio registration JSC4504, VIN 3C4PDDAGXET227129, registered to Karen Delaney, a white female born November 17, 1967, with an address of 1239 Tweed Avenue, Steubenville, Ohio.

The trooper's vehicle was a 2024 Dodge Durango bearing Ohio State Patrol registration OSP [REDACTED], VIN [REDACTED], owned by the State of Ohio and assigned as Unit # [REDACTED].

During the photographic documentation of the scene, several items were located on the pavement, including four cartridge casings (Items 1, 2, 3, and 7) north of the Dodge Journey. Each casing was determined to be a GLR-brand 9mm Luger cartridge casing.

SA Lulla and SA Doran began the examination of OSP Cruiser # [REDACTED]. While examining the interior of the vehicle, a WIN-brand 9mm cartridge casing was recovered from the driver's floor (Item 6).

Upon further examination, five additional WIN-brand 9mm cartridge casings were discovered on the vehicle's cowl and marked as Items 8, 9, 10, 11, and 12.

The SAs examined four ballistic impacts (B.I.) that were observed near the upper left corner of the cruiser's front windshield.

B.I. #1.0



Secondary impact

B.I. #1.0 A projectile perforated the doorframe of the driver's door while traveling from the front to the back, leaving an elliptical-shaped hole, with a secondary impact observed further back on the doorframe. The projectile came to rest inside the doorframe and was not recovered.



B.I. #2.0

B.I. #2.0 A projectile perforated the roof of the vehicle, traveling from the front to the back and slightly left to right, leaving an elliptical-shaped hole. The projectile terminated between the roof and the headliner of the vehicle and was not recovered.

B.I. #3.0

B.I. #3.0 A projectile, traveling from front to back, struck the top edge of the front windshield before perforating the roof, leaving an irregular circular hole. The projectile terminated between the roof and the headliner of the vehicle and was not recovered.



B.I. #4.0

B.I. #4.0 A projectile, traveling from front to back and slightly left to right, perforated the roof of the vehicle, leaving an elliptical-shaped hole. The projectile terminated between the roof and the headliner and was not recovered.

**B.I. #5.0
Interior plastic molding on left front (driver's) door**

B.I. #5.0 A projectile penetrated the interior plastic molding of the driver's window frame, leaving a circular hole. The position of the driver's door when it was struck could not be determined. The projectile traveled from the interior side of the door outward. The projectile was not recovered.

Trajectory rods were placed in B.I.# 1.0 and B.I.# 4.0, which were later scanned using the BLK360 scanner to determine the trajectory that the bullet had traveled prior to striking the vehicle.

Following the documentation of the B.I. on Cruiser [REDACTED], the examination of this vehicle was complete.

Upon the arrival of SA Joe Goudy at Scene 2, he informed SA Lulla and SA Doran that he had obtained consent from the vehicle's owner, Karen Delaney, to search the Dodge Journey. A copy of the consent to search form will be uploaded into Matrix.

The processing of the Dodge Journey began with obtaining photographic documentation of the vehicle followed by a search for items of apparent evidentiary value.

During the examination of the vehicle's interior, a copper jacket was located on the right front passenger seat (Item 13), and a projectile was located on the dashboard (Item 14). Additional items recovered included a GFL brand 9mm Luger cartridge found on the right front floor (Item 15) and a GFL brand 9mm Luger cartridge casing located on the left front floor (Item 16).

Using sterile cotton swabs moistened with Stain Extraction Buffer, a blind swab was collected from the left rear interior door handle for possible touch DNA recovery (Item 17). Additional swabs were collected in the same manner from the left front interior door handle (Item 18) and from the steering wheel (Item 19).

B.I. #1.0

B.I. #1.0 The bullet perforated the rear tailgate leaving a symmetrical hole and traveled from back to front. A secondary impact was located on the interior side of the tailgate. The bullet continued into the passenger cabin.

B.I. #2.0

B.I. #2.0 The bullet perforated the left rear bumper traveling from back to front and right to left. A nearly symmetrical hole was made; however, a trajectory rod was unable to be inserted.

A piece of plastic was discovered on the pavement below a hole in the vehicle's left rear bumper, and the plastic trim behind the rear left tire was damaged. Based on the damage, it appeared as though the bullet entered the bumper on the rear of the vehicle, traveling right to left and back to front, and struck the rear bumper on the driver's side, behind the rear left tire. No bullet was recovered from this apparent impact.

Damage on Dodge Journey's left rear bumper

After a trajectory rod was placed in B.I. #1.0 the area was scanned using the Leica BLK360 scanner to determine the trajectory that the bullet had traveled prior to striking the vehicle.

Due to the Dodge Journey's rear windshield being shattered and a bullet being recovered from its dashboard (Item 14), it was believed the rear windshield had possibly sustained a B.I. An apparent B.I. was observed on the Journey's headliner; however, no trajectory could be determined.

Following the documentation of the B.I. to the Dodge Journey, the examination of this vehicle was complete.
