Investigative Request

On Tuesday, January 20, 2026, Captain Johnathan R. Strawser of the Pickaway County Sheriff's Office requested the assistance of the Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation (BCI) Force Investigations Unit (FIU) and Crime Scene Unit (CSU) in conducting an independent investigation into the facts and circumstances surrounding an officer-involved critical incident. The incident reportedly occurred on January 20, 2026 in the area of 4800 Duvall Road, Lot 303, Ashville, Ohio and resulted in the death of Chase Dalton.

Preface:

This report serves as a synopsis of the investigation into the January 20, 2026 officer-involved shooting in Pickaway County, Ohio. This report only summarizes the information that the investigative team determined to be the most useful in achieving an overall understanding of what occurred in this incident. Every fact and detail is not presented in this summary report. Therefore, it is recommended that each individual report from which this document is derived be read in order to obtain a complete understanding of this investigation. Further, audio and/or video recordings exist for the majority of the interviews conducted, revealing further details of statements given regarding the incident.

This investigation was conducted with the purpose of determining, to the extent possible, the facts and circumstances surrounding this incident. As unbiased collectors of fact, the investigative team has not and will not render any opinion of the legality of officers' actions. Instead, it is anticipated that this investigation will provide the basis of information for decisions to be rendered by the appropriate authorities.

Investigative Team

BCI Special Agent Joshua Welty (SA Welty) was assigned as the lead FIU case agent. SA Welty received assistance in the investigation from SA Chad Holcomb (SA Holcomb), SA Richard Ward, SA James Gore, SA Perry Roeser, SA Amanda North, SA Mathew Austin, and SA Kyle Douglass. BCI Crime Scene Technicians Holly Ryczek and Amy Cruet of the Crime Scene Unit processed the scene of the incident, documenting, preserving, and collecting possible evidence. The investigation was supervised by Special Agent Supervisor Kevin Barbeau. Additionally, various personnel from the BCI crime laboratory performed scientific analyses on submitted items of potential physical evidence.

Summary of Process

The following is a partial list of investigative activities or methods which were employed during the course of this investigation, by the investigative team, in an effort to thoroughly and accurately locate and document all pertinent facts and circumstances regarding this incident:

- Typed statement(s) of the four (4) officers who discharged their weapons
- Recorded interviews of two (2) officers who were involved in the incident, at the scene, or otherwise deemed to potentially have relevant information
- Neighborhood canvass of the area surrounding the scene
- Recorded interview of other subjects directly involved in the incident
- Interviews of family members or associates of the decedent
- Special agent attendance at post-mortem examination (autopsy) of the deceased
- Post-mortem examination (autopsy) and toxicology reports have been reviewed
- Obtained and reviewed open and closed-source biographical information on the involved subjects, to include criminal history reports, OHLEG, driving records, etc.
- FBI National Crime Information Center (NCIC) checks on any non-law enforcement weapons involved in the incident (to determine if reported stolen)
- Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (ATF) trace on any non-law enforcement weapons involved in the incident (to determine ownership history)
- Review of all available body cameras involved in the incident
- Processing of the scene for potential evidence (photographing, searching, measuring, documenting, and collecting)
- 3D scans / model of incident area

Incident Summary/Overview

On January 20, 2026, Ohio BCI was requested by the Pickaway County Sheriff's Office (PCSO) to investigate an officer-involved critical incident that occurred on January 20, 2026. Agents were informed that PCSO had received 911 calls of a possible sexual assault (rape) in progress at 4800 Duvall Road, Lot 303. The sexual assault was involving Chase Dalton (Chase) and [REDACTED]. Additional 911 calls were placed to PCSO indicating there were shots fired at lot 303.

Upon officer's arrival, they encountered Dalton outside the residence at lot 303. Dalton was in possession of a firearm and was given commands by responding law

enforcement. Eventually, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] discharged their firearms, critically injuring Dalton; he was pronounced deceased at Grant Medical Center.

It should be noted that BCI did not investigate the rape allegation as this was investigated by the local jurisdiction.

Decedent

Chase Aleczander Dalton

No criminal history was discovered upon querying Chase's personal identification information in law enforcement databases.

Chase's mother, Brandy Dalton, shared there were truancy issues while the decedent was still in grad school. Brandy also shared there was an occurrence when Chase stole an ice cream cake from a Dairy Queen when he was younger.

Autopsy Report

The autopsy of the decedent (Chase Aleczander Dalton) was conducted at the Franklin County Coroner's Office. The post-mortem examination was led by Dr. Antoine Wrice, M.D. Dr. Wrice listed the cause of death for Chase as "[REDACTED]". The manner of death was listed as "[REDACTED]". Dr. Wrice notated [REDACTED] in his report, including direction of travel. He further described the medical intervention present on Chase. A toxicology report concluded that [REDACTED] during a systematic toxicological analysis.

Physical Evidence

The BCI Crime Scene Unit was requested to respond to the scene of the shooting to document and preserve any items of potential evidence. Multiple agents responded and processed the scene, to include photographing and mapping the area, as well as the search for, documentation, and collection of items of possible evidence. Detailed crime scene reports were completed with the below information only summarizing some of the more significant findings.

The BCI Firearms Section performed an analysis of the officers' firearms, as well as the firearm-related evidence collected from the scene, vehicles, and autopsies (casings and bullets). By comparing evidentiary cartridge casings/projectiles to known standards from each weapon, identifications were able to be made as to which casings/projectiles were fired from each firearm. Of the casings/projectiles recovered, the following identifications were made:

1. Lab item #1: Glock pistol (SN: ██████████) possessed by ██████████
 - a. Lab items #2 and #24 were source identified to lab item #1
 - b. Lab item #1 was found to be operable
2. Lab item #6: Taurus pistol (SN: AHC801854) found near Chase Dalton
 - a. Lab items #5, #15, and #16 were source identified to lab item #6
 - b. Lab item #6 was found to be operable
3. Lab item #9: Springfield Armory pistol (SN: BB421273) found near Chase Dalton
 - a. Lab items #5 and #18 were source identified to lab item #9
 - b. Lab item #9 was found to be operable
4. Lab item #20: Glock pistol (SN: ██████████) possessed by ██████████
 - a. Lab items #2, #10, and #24 were source identified to lab item #20
 - b. Lab item #20 was found to be operable
5. Lab item #21: Glock pistol (SN: ██████████) possessed by ██████████

Witnesses

██████████ - Lot 303

██████████ reported she currently resides at ██████████. ██████████ explains she lives there ██████████. ██████████ has been living with ██████████ as part of their living arrangement. ██████████ and ██████████ are not romantically involved. On the date of the incident, ██████████ ██████████ brother, Chase Dalton (Chase), had spent the previous night there. ██████████ left for work at approximately 0900 hours.

██████████ called 911 at approximately 1451 hours. While ██████████ was on the phone with the 911 dispatcher, Chase was screaming at her to let him back into the house and was banging on the door from outside. ██████████ was still on the phone with 911 when Chase attempted to shoot the deadbolt lock off the exterior door with a gun and force his way back into the house. ██████████ had not seen Chase with a gun that day but was aware Chase kept firearms in his vehicle. ██████████ reported Chase drives a black Nissan sedan. ██████████ described the gun she had seen previously as being dark green and black. ██████████ estimated Chase fired five to six gunshots into the door.

██████████ recalled hearing the police arrive, shortly after which she heard a "series" of gunshots. ██████████ could hear the police shouting verbal commands to Chase to drop his gun. ██████████ then heard police officers trying to gain access to the house, after which she exited the bathroom and opened a back door to allow police inside. Police officers immediately took ██████████ out of the house. ██████████ believed that Richard may have been present during the shooting incident or shortly after.

Family Member Interviews

Destiny Eitel (Sister) & Brandy Dalton (Mother)

In the afternoon of January 20th, Brandy shared she looked at her phone and discovered messages from Chase. The messages: "Laptop password is ██████████ sell it get some money I fucked yo and I'm gonna die I'm sorry I love u ma ur the only one I love in life fuck all my other family," "I'm really sorry," "I love u im so sorry ma pls don't be sad you raised me well im just an evil piece of shit." After receiving the messages, Brandy attempted to call Chase, but he never answered the phone.

Destiny then shared that on January 10th, while Chase was intoxicated, he stated, "he was leaving... he was going somewhere next week." Brandy said Chase had told her; "mom, I'm going to die next week." Due to Chase's intoxicated state, Brandy shared she did not want to contact 9-1-1, in fear he would get upset she contacted law enforcement.

SA Welty asked if they knew Chase possessed firearms. Destiny was not aware Chase had firearms. Brandy was aware Chase had a firearm but thought he got rid of it. She described the gun as being a handgun, not a revolver. This occurred around November/December 2025. Destiny and Brandy were asked if Chase would consume alcohol, to which Brandy indicated yes. She described Chase as being 'drunk' only three times. Brandy further shared Chase had recently experimented with shrooms and marijuana but had not seen Chase using them, only learning about his use through talking about them.

Richard Dalton Jr. (Brother)

Richard Jr. explained he had received some texts from [REDACTED] requesting him to come home; indicating it was an emergency. Richard Jr. then called [REDACTED] and she further shared she was calling the police and that Richard Jr.'s brother, Chase Dalton (Chase), had just raped her. After speaking with [REDACTED] Richard Jr. contacted his father, Richard Dalton Sr. (Richard Sr.), and requested that he go to the house. Once he had finished speaking with his father, Richard Jr. noticed messages from Chase.

Richard Jr. permitted SA Holcomb permission to photograph a text message thread between him and Chase from the day of the OICI. Contained in the thread were messages from Chase stating the following: *"I don't want a funeral," "Burn me," "I don't want remembered man burn and forget me," "Just act like I never existed that's all I've wanted for a while."*

Richard Jr. shared he called Chase after receiving the messages, to which Chase answered the phone call. Richard Jr. explained he asked Chase what was going on but there was no response from Chase. Instead, Richard Jr. heard gunshots and the call ended. According to Richard Jr., Chase called him back and they were on the call for what he estimates to be 10 - 15 minutes.

During the call, Richard Jr. explained he could hear police in the background. He heard the police telling Chase to put down the gun. Richard Jr. made specific reference to Chase saying, "I don't know, I haven't decided if I wanna shoot myself or if I want you to do it." Richard Jr. then heard an officer reply, "we don't want to shoot you," which

was then followed by Chase saying, "that one definitely looks like he wants to shoot me."

Richard Jr. further explained he tried to talk Chase into putting down the gun, or at least to not point it at anyone. He shared Chase eventually stopped talking to him on the phone but left the line open. Richard Jr. asked how they got to this situation, to which he stated Chase replied, "I raped [REDACTED] that is how we got here."

Officer Interviews

The following paragraphs are extremely abbreviated versions of each officer's account of his or her actions pertaining to this incident and/or discharging their weapon. More detailed accounts can be found by reading the separate reports written by the interviewers and by reviewing the recordings of each interview.

[REDACTED]

"I continued to give verbal commands for the male to drop his gun and even begged him to drop his gun so we could talk when I noticed a Deputy arrive and take cover at the corner of the trailer. At some point the Deputy asked his name and he said he name was Chase. I continued to have the conversation with Chase and continued to asked Chase to drop the gun and to give us a chance to help fix whatever this issue was. Chase looked up at me and said Should I have you shoot me or should I shoot myself, or something to that effect. I told Chase we didn't have to do this. Chase talked to at least four of us asking which would be the one to shoot him. Chase did request that we shoot him in the head if we did so it would be over fast. I begged Chase to just throw the gun down and give us a chance to help him fix this."

"I did hear a voice that appeared to be Fire Chief Shawn Davidson said over the radio that a male was running back to our location. Later I did hear a male yelling from behind where I was standing and then heard Sheriff Haffey behind me trying to get the male to move back. I looked back to make sure I wasn't going to get attacked from behind and saw that Sheriff Haffey had the male."

"When I turned back around to Chase, I saw Chase raise his right arm and present the gun then shot at me. Out of fear for my life and sheriff Haffey's life, who I knew was behind me, and others that were outside near me, I have no alternative but to immediately shoot at Chase to defend myself and others. I shot at Chase two times in the chest area and saw no movement so I shot one more time and that's when I noticed Chase fell off the porch. I shot unit he was no longer an active threat pointing or shooting a gun at me, based on my training. I ran up to Chase who was laying on the ground and I moved the silver handgun away and stood between Chase and the gun so

he could not get to it, while another officer started placing Chase in handcuffs and also started applying first aid. Again, this was based on my training."

██████████

"The suspect on the porch raised his gun toward ██████████ which was to my right, and discharged at least one shot in that direction at ██████████ I then discharged my firearm twice towards the subject because I was in the immediate fear for my life as well as the live of other officers and civilians in the area, and I had no other alternative to protect my life or other. The suspect took away my other alternatives and took away my ability to physically take him down when he pointed his firearm and shot towards ██████████."

"I saw the suspect fall from the porch and down the steps, which is when I stopped firing because at that time, the threat of being shot and killed and the threat of having either ██████████ or someone else being shot and killed was over."

██████████

"Around that time Sheriff M. Hafey arrived on scene and was with me at the one and two side of the trailer. A short time later a male while ran onto scene claiming to be the suspects brother and Sheriff Hafey left to stop him. I once again commanded the suspect to drop the gun, but he did not comply. The suspect then raised and aimed the handgun in the direction of where ██████████ and myself were standing and fired at least one shot. I was in fear for my life and the lives of everyone around me. I fired several shots, striking the suspect several times, continuing to shoot until the threat was stopped. As a law enforcement officer, I am trained to shoot until the threat is neutralized."

"I used lethal force because I do not believe that there was any less lethal force that I could have used that would be effective in stopping the immediate and direct threat that the suspect posed to myself and others by his actions in point and firing his gun towards myself and ██████████. My actions in firing my firearm, as described above, was consistent with my training and experience as a law enforcement officer."

"Immediately following the shooting ██████████ and myself along with other Officers approached the suspect. As I was approaching, I observed the black and silver handgun on the ground near the porch along with another handgun on the porch."

"I then heard another law enforcement officer telling an individual to stay back, in the area of where [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] were located. The unknown second male yelled out "that's my brother" and the male standing on the porch looked up and in the area of [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. The suspect was once again ordered to drop the firearm and he did not comply."

"I observed the male standing on the porch, raise his right hand, point the handgun in the area of [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] and I heard a shot fired. I was in fear for the lives of [REDACTED] and myself along with others on scene, I discharged my duty weapon approximately 3-4 times at the male. The male then fell from the top of the porch onto the ground. As a law enforcement officer, I am trained to shoot until the threat is neutralized."

"I used lethal force because I do not believe that there was less than lethal force that I could have used that would have been effective in stopping the immediate and direct threat that the suspect posed to myself and others by his actions in pointing and firing a gun towards [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. My actions in firing my firearm as described above were consistent with my training and experience as a law enforcement officer."

Witness Officers

Sheriff Matthew O. Hafey

Upon arrival on scene, Sheriff Hafey observed a male wearing a reflective vest running toward the incident location. The male was later identified as Richard Dalton Jr., the brother of Chase Dalton. Hafey observed [REDACTED] positioned at the 1-4 corner of the residence. He also observed Ashville [REDACTED] positioned near a tree, along with other officers around the perimeter. Hafey heard [REDACTED] repeatedly yell, "Put the gun down."

While positioned behind [REDACTED], Hafey observed Richard Dalton Jr. approaching from the rear. As Hafey turned to intercept Richard Dalton Jr. and remove him from a potential threat area, he heard multiple gunshots.

Richard Dalton Jr. began screaming and was restrained by others as Sheriff Hafey proceeded toward the scene where Chase Dalton was lying. Hafey retrieved a trauma kit; however, medics and South Bloomfield Police [REDACTED] were already performing life-saving measures.
