APPROVAL, CONTRACT BETWEEN STATE OF OHIO AND THE D. CONNELLY BOILER COMPANY OF CLEVELAND, OHIO, FOR ONE BOILER AND WESTINGHOUSE STOKER, AND BRICK WORK COMPLETE, FOR CLEVELAND STATE HOSPITAL, CLEVELAND, OHIO, AT AN EXPENDITURE OF \$13,685.00—SURETY BOND EXECUTED BY THE STANDARD ACCIDENT INSURANCE COMPANY OF DETROIT, MICHIGAN.

DEAR SIR:—You have submitted for my approval a contract between the State of Ohio, acting by the Department of Public Welfare, and The D. Connelly Boiler Company, of Cleveland, Ohio. This contract covers the construction and completion of 1-Four Drum Semi-Vertical type 350 H. P. Boiler, and Westinghouse Stoker, and brick work complete, for Cleveland State Hospital, Cleveland, Ohio, and calls for an expenditure of thirteen thousand six hundred and eighty-five (\$13,685.00) dollars.

You have submitted the certificate of the Director of Finance to the effect that there are unencumbered balances legally appropriated in a sum sufficient to cover the obligations of the contract. You have also submitted a certificate from the Controlling Board showing that said board's consent has been obtained to the expenditure of the moneys appropriated by the 88th General Assembly for the purpose covered by this contract, in accordance with Section 11 of House Bill 510. In addition, you have submitted a contract bond upon which the Standard Accident Insurance Company of Detroit, Michigan, appears as surety, sufficient to cover the amount of the contract.

You have further submitted evidence indicating that plans were properly prepared and approved, notice to bidders was properly given, bids tabulated as required by law and the contract duly awarded. Also it appears that the laws relating to the status of surety companies and the workmen's compensation have been complied with.

Finding said contract and bond in proper legal form, I have this day noted my approval thereon and return the same herewith to you, together with all other data submitted in this connection.
