
## Summary:

On Thursday, June 20, 2024, BCI Crime Scene Technician Michael Rostocil attended the autopsy of Shannon Sloan (DOB: 6/28/1969) which was conducted at the Cuyahoga County Medical Examiner's Office (11001 Cedar Avenue, Cleveland, OH 44106).

## Narrative:

On Thursday, June 20, 2024, at 0815 hours, CST Rostocil contacted the Cuyahoga County Medical Examiner's Office and spoke with the Investigations Unit regarding the autopsy of Shannon Sloan. CST Rostocil learned that the autopsy would be conducted between 0930-1000 hours.

At approximately 0915 hours, CST Rostocil arrived at the Cuyahoga County Medical Examiner's Office and attended the autopsy of Shannon Sloan, which began at approximately 1000 hours and was conducted by Dr. A. Krywanczyk.



CST Rostocil cleared from the Cuyahoga County Medical Examiner's Office at approximately 1215 hours.
