On Monday, June14th, 2021 at 23:23 hours, Officers responded to the 1400 block of S. Center Blvd. in reference to a male shot. Officers responded to the scene and observed a male lying on the south bound lane in front of 1363 S. Center Blvd. The male was identified as Eric E. Cole of 1207 S. Center Blvd. The male appeared to have a gun shot wound to the left arm and left shoulder.

Springfield fire responded to the scene and transported Mr. Cole to Springfield Regional Medical Center. Mr. Cole was then transported to Miami Valley Hospital via Care Flight.

Officer Walter collected a cell phone, and white blood stained T shirt from the scene. While at the hospital, Officer Walter collected a pair of black tennis shoes, blue jean shorts, and gray underwear, and \$40.00 cash owned by the victim.

The property was recorded on property receipt number 20475 and submitted into locker A. There are no suspects at this time.

Sir,

On June 13, 2021 at 2323hrs dispatch dropped tones in reference to a male that had been shot. When the tones were dropped I was in a two man vehicle with Officer Schmidt. We were responding from W. High St. just east of S. Yellow Springs St. I did not hear the address so I asked Officer Schmidt what the address was that we were going to. We both waited for the call to be sent to our computer to see the address but when it didn't officers began asking over the radio what the address was. There was several different addresses given before it was finally said to go to 1407 S. Center St. I drove down W. High St. to S. Center and took it all the way south to 1407 S. Center St.

When pulling up on scene I pulled up next to the male in the road and advised Officer Schmidt to begin first aide while I grabbed the camera to take initial photos. When getting up to the male he was conscious and talking. Officer Schmidt began trying to roll him over to check to see where his wounds were due to his shirt being bloody on the left side. I advised him to cut the shirt off so we could see easier. Officer Schmidt and Walter then cut his shift off. Once his shirt was off he appeared to loose consciousness. Officer Schmidt then felt for a pulse and then began CPR. He pumped on his chest just a few times until I advised him to check for a pulse again. When checking again he advised he felt a pulse. He then began talking to officers again. I was then able to see where he was shot on his left side in the shoulder and the side. I took several photos of his wounds. When looking at his back I was able to see that he had what appeared to be road rash on his shoulder blades on his back.

Once I was done with initial photos I then began moving cruisers to block the road to secure the scene. I moved my cruiser to the side of the road out of the way and moved Officer Rosales's cruiser down the road and onto the northbound lane of S. Center to block traffic from coming north. I also advised dispatch to have the medics come down the north bound lane so they were able to load the male up and go without being blocked in.

After photos were taken I was advised that Officer Schmidt had located a vehicle to the rear of 1363 S. Center St. that the shooting victim was possibly in. I then was able to follow a trail of blood from where the male was laying in the road to the rear of 1363 where we were able to see in plain view blood inside the vehicle and around the vehicle. The driver side rear window was also partially busted out and there was no glass on the ground by the vehicle. I was also able to feel the heat coming from the engine bay indicating that the vehicle had just been driven. Officer Schmidt then advised me he located a bag on the back porch of 1363 and could see a pistol in plain view.

Officer Schmidt then knocked on the back door of the house to attempt to make contact with the homeowner to see if they were familiar with the vehicle. The male advised he lent the vehicle to someone but he only had it due to he was working on it for someone. He stated the male was just using the vehicle to go to one of the gas stations on Selma

Rd. to pick up a few things. He advised officers that the broken window on the driver side rear was new damage. I then contacted dispatch to inquire if there were any shots fired calls in the area of Selma Rd. at East St. They asked if I had spoke with Sgt. Taylor yet for which I had not. They informed me this incident was possibly related to a shots fired call that was on Liberty St.

I then went back out to the front and spoke with Sgt. Taylor. I asked him if a scene log needed completed. He stated that the property unit was coming in to process the scene and that the log needed completed. I then began filling out the crime scene log with names and times of Officers that were on scene. Sgt. Taylor then requested I go back to the vehicle that was behind 1363 and double check to see if there were any bullet holes in the car. When checking the side of the vehicle more meticulously I was able to observe a bullet hole in the rear side panel of the vehicle that appeared to exit out the rear of the rear wheel well. I then informed Sgt. Taylor of my findings.

I then stood by on scene until the property unit arrived. I spoke with Sgt. Pergram and Off. Byron advising them of the blood trail leading from where the male was laying in the road to the vehicle that was located behind 1363. I also informed them of the bag and pistol that was located and the bullet hole in the rear side panel of the vehicle. I was then advised by Sgt. Taylor to clear the scene and that Officer Emory was going to stand by with the property unit and would complete the crime scene log.

Upon arrival, officers located the male (later identified as Eric Cole) laying in the middle of the south bound lane of travel on S. Center Blv. Mr. Cole appeared to have sustained two gun shot wounds, one on his left shoulder, and one on his upper left arm. Officer Schmidt asked Mr. Cole who shot him to which he responded that he did not know. Off. Schmidt and Emory began looking for the wounds as they observed the left side of his shirt had blood on it. Officers located an apparent bullet. Officers cut his shirt off to get a better look at where he had been shot. Officer Peterson took photographs of Mr. Cole. Medics then arrived on scene and transported him to SRMC.

Off. Rosales advised Off. Schmidt and Off. Peterson that there was a trail of blood coming from the rear of 1363 S. Center Blv. Off. Schmidt then walked there and located a Chevy Trailblazer (Ohio Registration HWV3615). The vehicle appeared to have the rear driver side window shot out. Off. Peterson advised that the vehicle was still hot. Off. Schmidt took photographs of the trail of blood and of the blood that was inside the vehicle.

On 6/13/2021 at 2323 hours, tones were dropped by dispatch in regards to a male shot near 1363 South Center Blvd. Officer Lyons and I, Officer Walter responded as emergent from Southgate Church on South Center Street.

Upon arrival I saw a black male laying in the street directly in front of 1363 South Center Blvd. Officers Emory and Schmidt were already on scene rendering aid to the male subject in the street. As I approached, the male was rolling back and forth while Officer Emory and Schmidt were trying to locate the injury. The male was wearing a white t-shirt with wet blood stains on the left side. The male laid his head back and arms out becoming unresponsive. The male still had a strong posterior tibial pulse and a visual rise and fall in his chest. After a few brief moments the male became alert again. I cut the males shirt off to get a better visual of the wound and to allow access for aid. Officer Emory located an entry wound in the male subjects back, near his left shoulder blade. Officer Schmidt then noticed a bulge in the males left bicep indicating a possible bullet fragment.

While rendering aid I attempted to get identification information as well as a possible subject, the male was breathing heavily and announced his name to be what I thought was Eric Gold. I asked the male, Gold as in G-O-L-D, he mumbled yes. He stated he did not know who shot him.

He advised his birth date as 10-2-1975. His actual name was Eric Cole with a birth date of 10-2-1978. Medics arrived on scene and took over aid.

Officer Schmidt and Rosales located a blood trail on the side walk in front of and to the North of 1363 South Center Blvd. The blood trail led to the rear of the address out to South Wittenberg Street. Located at the rear of the residence was a black Chevy Trailblazer with a broken rear drivers side window. The hood of the Trailblazer was still hot to the touch, indicating recent operation. There was glass inside of the vehicle but none outside the vehicle. The drivers steering wheel, door, seat and floor board had blood smeared on them. The garage to the rear of the residence at 1363 also had bullet holes in the East window. Officer Schmidt documented the photos at the scene while Officer Lyons and I went to SRMC.

Upon arrival at SRMC I took photos while Mr. Cole was still in the Trauma 1 room. Mr. Cole was alert and was able to indicate his location at the hospital. I took Mr. Cole's clothing for evidence. Med flight arrived and transported Mr. Cole to Miami Valley.

I assisted in the care of this male until medics arrived on scene. The male did not give any information regarding who shot him or where this took place. I then made contact with multiple parties who were arriving on scene. None of these individuals knew what had happened.

Sir,

On 6/13/2021 at 2323 hours, tones were dropped by dispatch in regards to a male shot near 1363 South Center Blvd. Officer Lyons and I, Officer Walter responded as emergent from Southgate Church on South Center Street.

Upon arrival I saw a black male laying in the street directly in front of 1363 South Center BIvd. Officers Emory and Schmidt were already on scene rendering aid to the male subject in the street. As I approached, the male was rolling back and forth while Officer Emory and Schmidt were trying to locate the injury. The male was wearing a white t-shirt with wet blood stains on the left side. The male laid his head back and arms out becoming unresponsive. The male still had a strong posterior tibial pulse and a visual rise and fall in his chest. After a few brief moments the male became alert again. I cut the males shirt off to get a better visual of the wound and to allow access for aid. Officer Emory located an entry wound in the male subjects back, near his left shoulder blade. Officer Schmidt then noticed a bulge in the males left bicep indicating a possible bullet fragment.

While rendering aid I attempted to get identification information as well as a possible subject. The male was breathing heavily and announced his name to be what I thought was Eric Gold. I asked the male, Gold as in G-O-L-D, he mumbled yes. He advised his birth date as 10-2-1975 after I asked several times for clarity. Due to Erics heavy breathing it was difficult in getting clear responses. His actual name was Eric Cole with a birth date of 10-2-1978. I asked Eric Who shot you? He kept replying I don t know, I can t breathe. I asked Eric what car was the shooter in and he stated I don t know, Im going to die I can t breathe. I had noticed what appeared to be road rash in between his shoulder blades when checking him for wounds and I asked Eric if he was pushed out of a car to which he replied I don t know, I can t breathe. I followed up with asking how he got in the street and he again replied I don't know, I can't breathe. Eric could not advise how many shooters or the direction of travel either. Eric wanted to sit up to try to catch his breath. I assisted him up, but he was very unstable, so I stood behind him for support until he laid back down. I stopped asking Eric questions due to his distressed breathing and not being able to provide any detail that would lead to information about the incident. I advised Eric I could hear Medics coming and stayed with him until they arrived on scene and took over aid.

Officer Schmidt and Rosales located a blood trail on the side walk in front of and to the North of 1363 South Center Blvd. The blood trail led to the rear of the address out to South Wittenberg Street. Located at the rear of the residence was a black Chevy Trailblazer with a broken rear drivers side window. The hood of the Trailblazer was still hot to the touch, indicating recent operation. There was glass inside of the vehicle but none outside the vehicle. The drivers steering wheel, door, seat and floor board had blood smeared on them. The garage to the rear of the residence at 1363 also had bullet

holes in the East window. Officer Schmidt documented the photos at the scene while Officer Lyons and I went to SRMC.

Upon arrival at SRMC Officer Ivory was already on scene. I took photos while Mr. Cole was still in the Trauma 1 room. Mr. Cole was alert and was able to indicate his location at the hospital to E. R. staff. I took Mr. Cole's clothing for evidence. Med flight arrived and transported Mr. Cole to Miami Valley.

A Springfield police officer who was put on administrative leave after she struck a shooting victim with her cruiser has no disciplinary records.

Amanda Rosales, 28, joined the police division in January 2020 after graduating from the Basic Peace Office Training Academy at Clark State College, according to personnel files obtained by the Springfield News-Sun.

Rosales was one of 15 police academy graduates in the fall of 2019, according to Clark State's

website. Each cadet spends 5-7 months in intense trainings, completing more than 730 hours.

According to her file, Rosales has no disciplinary records and has received merit increases each year.

# Injuries detailed for man hit by police car

Springfield man had blunt force trauma, broken sternum, ribs.

By Brooke Spurlock and Parker Perry Staff Writers

The man who was shot by an unknown assailant and then run over by a responding police officer had blunt-force trauma to several body parts along with a gunshot wound, according to preliminary autopsy report by the Montgomery County Coroner's Office.

Eric Eugene Cole, 42, of Springfield, died Monday morning after the incident Sunday night on South Center Boulevard.

In the coroner's investigator

report, the office said a nurse at Miami Valley Hospital notified them of Cole's death. It says a coroner investigator called Springfield police about the

death and a sergeant said he "may have been struck by a vehicle and shot in the left arm."

Officers were dispatched around 11:22 p.m. Sunday to the 1400 block of South Center Boulevard on a report someone had been shot. Officer Amanda Rosales was the first officer to respond to the scene and was "involved in an accident" with Cole, according to police.

The preliminary findings show that Cole had blunt-force trauma to his torso, including abrasions on his back and lower chest, lacerations on his left shoulder and back, and fracture of his sternum and of multiple ribs.

He also had blunt-force trauma to his extremities, including bruises on his right arm, abrasions on his arms, left knee and legs, and a gunshot in his left arm.

Cole's cause of death is pending, the report stated. The caliber of the weapon used to shoot Cole is unknown, and no one is in custody at this time.

Funeral services have been set with visitation at noon and service at 1 p.m. on Wednesday at Restored Life Ministries, 1117

Innisfallen Ave. in Springfield. The burial will follow at Ferncliff Cemetery, according to his obituary.

Cole's family demanded answers and voiced concerns about his death and the response to the scene at a news conference earlier this week.

His cousin, Donita Cosey, said the family feels the police are not being fully transparent and the family was not told sooner that Cole had been struck by a police

vehicle. She said the family was only notified later that a police vehicle had hit Cole.

Regina Wilson, Cole's mother, said she didn't know her son had been hit by a police cruiser until a doctor at Miami Valley Hospital told her. A police officer at the scene just said he was shot in the arm, she said.

Springfield Police Chief Lee Graf said Rosales did not see Cole on the street because she was reportedly looking at houses for addresses and the officer stopped immediately and began to render aid after the incident.

According to records

obtained by the Springfield News-Sun, at least seven people called 911 regarding the shooting incident, including Cole.

"Please come and get me. I'm about to die... I'm in the middle of the street," Cole told 911 dispatchers. "Somebody shot me in the arm. I don't know who shot me. I'm dying."

Cosey said she is in disbelief and asked how the officer did not see her cousin on the road.

According to the recordings, Cole was also on the phone with dispatchers when he was struck by a cruiser.

He is heard on the call saying, "They just hit me, the police."

Rosales has been placed on administrative leave, Graf said. "This was an accident," he said at the news conference. "That doesn't mean it's OK. This was not an intentional act by the officer. I am sure of that."

Springfield police are investigating the shooting and the Ohio State Highway Patrol is investigating the incident involving Rosales.

# Police advisory team outlines intentions

Springfield group addresses Rotary Club, emphasizes diversity.

Springfield's newly revamped Community Police Advisory Team will focus on examining and cultivating diversity and representation within all levels of the city's police division as well as strengthening relationships between officers and the community they serve.

The chairperson of the advisory team James Bacon, along with vice chair Lauren Kelley, addressed members of the Springfield Rotary Club this month highlighting their intentions and goals.

They shared information regarding the team's guiding principles as well as what they hope to accomplish, especially following national calls last year to end police brutality and renewed

conversations centered on racial injustice.

The team features nine community members who were appointed and approved by city officials late last year. Those selected by the city are expected to serve a three-year term and are tasked with a number of responsibilities related to the police division.

Those responsibilities relate to the recruitment and retention of a racially and culturally diverse police force on all levels as well as reviewing and providing recommendations regarding policy, procedures and equipment used by local police officers.

The team is similar to the Police Community Relations Advisory Group that fizzled out in the city in 2012. The revamped advisory team will also be tasked with community engagement, reviewing

and introducing training practices that address bias as well as reviewing police data and investigative reports regarding police conduct.

The team will not be in charge of conducting any investigations within the department and instead will be part of an oversight process that includes reviewing the results of those investigations.

That also means being involved in communication with the community regarding incidents such as what happened this month related to Springfield resident Eric Cole, a shooting victim who was struck by a police cruiser responding to the scene.

Cole, 42, was flown by CareFlight to Miami Valley Hospital in Dayton, where he died June 14. The incident took place the previous night. Cole was struck by a police cruiser as he lay on the street bleeding from a gunshot wound. The police officer was responding to reports of a shooting.

The officer involved in the incident was identified as Amanda Rosales. She was placed on administrative leave. The Springfield Police Division is conducting the investigation into the shooting, while the Ohio State

goals are to display and deliver genuine concern of the issues we face, while consistently sharing our purpose and what we represent," Bacon told the Rotarians.

"We have to create and deliver an atmosphere of inclusion, so the broader community can embrace the mission and remove any doubt that they may harbor," he added, noting that a number of cases across the country involving police officers have been marked by a lack of transparency and community trust.

# Over 100 in Springfield demand justice for man

# Local gunshot victim died after he was hit by police cruiser.

SPRINGFIELD - More than 100 people gathered Wednesday afternoon in downtown Springfield, demanding justice and accountability after a local gunshot victim died after he was hit by a police cruiser that was responding to the shooting.

Eric Cole, 42, was shot by an unknown assailant the night of June 13 and was laying in the street, bleeding, in the 1400 block of South Center Boulevard when he was struck by the Springfield Police Division cruiser.

Cole was flown to Miami Valley Hospital, where he died from his injuries the following day.

Those who gathered outside of Springfield City

Hall on Wednesday said they want the officer involved in the incident to be held accountable. They also called for more transparency surrounding the case.

The event was organized by Springfield native Dion Green. In addition to Cole's family, several mothers whose sons were killed by police officers in the country were in attendance. That included Adrienne Hood, of Columbus, whose son Henry Green was shot and killed by Columbus police in 2016.

Dion Green said those int at the demonstrate in mourning over Cole's death and that demonstrations will continue until charges are levied against the officer involved.

Green said that there has to be accountability because he along with the family believe that Cole's death could have been prevented.

Those who participated in the demonstration marched from City Hall to the police station, where some laid n the street, before going to the Clark County Court-

house demanding answers.

City officials declined to comment regarding the demonstration. However, a spokesperson with the city stated that City Hall was closed from noon to 5 p.m., Wednesday as a safety precaution.

The official cause of Cole's death has not been determined.

But a preliminary autopsy report by the Montgomery County Coroner's Office showed that Cole had bluntforce trauma to several body parts along with a gunshot wound.

The officer involved in the incident was identified as Amanda Rosales. She was placed on administrative leave, according to Springfield Police Chief Lee Graf.

The Springfield Police Division is investigating Cole's shooting and the Ohio State Highway Patrol is investigating the striking of Cole by the police cruiser.

"This was an accident. That doesn't mean it's OK. This was not an intentional act by the officer. I am sure of that," Graf said at a press conference on June 16.

Graf added that Rosales

did not see Cole on the street and that the officer stopped immediately and began to render aid after the incident.

However, Cole's family said that they want the officer involved in the incident to be punished for running over Cole. Those family members also questioned accounts that Rosales did not see Cole on the road.

Organizers of the event said they want to make those in charge uncomfortable until they see change.

Speakers at the event also called for criminal charges to be levied against Rosales. It's a sentiment shared by members of Cole's family who feel that the police division has withheld information from them.

"At the end of the day if we don't do it, nobody else is going to do it. It is our responsibility to continue to echo his name day in and day out," activist Karla Carey said of Cole on Wednesday.

Carey, of Columbus, was one of several people who spoke to the crowd during the demonstration.

# Special prosecutor named in Cole death

Ohio AG makes appointment in case involving Springfield officer.

The Ohio Attorney General's Office was appointed as a special prosecutor for the case of Eric Cole's death.

The Clark County Prosecutor's Office requested that Ohio Attorney General Dave Yost's office be appointed as a Special Prosecutor in the matter of the death of Eric Cole "to ensure that there was no appearance of a Conflict of Interest in this case," a press release from the prosecutor's office stated.

"I believe this office could have handled this case in an impartial and professional manner. However, there are times when even the appearance of bias can erode faith in the justice system," Clark County Prosecutor Dan Driscoll said in a release. "The involvement of a Springfield Police Division officer in this case and the allegations made by the family of Mr. Cole have led me to believe that any involvement from this office would be viewed as unfair and biased."

Steve Irwin, press secretary of the Attorney General's Office, told the News-Sun that the office's Special Prosecution section is "frequently called upon by county prosecutors to provide independent review or expert assistance in criminal cases."

Cole's death has been the subject of community demonstrations, with community members and members of his family demanding justice and accountability for him.

Lekesha Bradford, the sister of Cole, told the News-Sun that her family learned of the appointment through the newspaper contacting them, and she's unsure of what the appointment of the Ohio Attorney General's Office as special prosecution to her brother's case means for the investigation.

"It's been two months and there's nothing that's been heard of anything," she said.

Springfield NAACP President Denise Williams said the state's involvement in the case was significant for the sake of impartiality.

"It's absolutely appropriate," Williams said. "That way we can have a different set of eyes to look at the situation objectively."

# Springfield man's death an accident, says report

Man shot by assailant was then run over by a responding officer.

The man who was shot by an unknown assailant and then run over by a responding officer died from blunt-force trauma to the torso and the incident was ruled an accident, according to the final autopsy report by the Montgomery County Coroner's Office.

Eric Eugene Cole, 42, of Springfield, died June 14 after the incident on the night of June 13 on

Cole's cause of death was bluntforce trauma to the torso and the manner of his death was an accident, the report stated.

coroner's findings.

"SPD investigators are reviewing the coroner's report as part of its internal probe of the accident and its criminal investigation of the shooting," Springfield city officials said Friday in a statement.

"The investigation of the vehicle-pedestrian accident is being conducted by the Ohio State Highway Patrol and the Ohio Attorney General's Office. SPD is cooperating fully with these agencies as they conduct their investigations," the statement said.

Officers were dispatched around 11:22 p.m. on June 13 to the 1400 block of South

of someone shot. Officer Amanda Rosales was the first officer to respond to the scene and was "involved in an accident" with Cole, according to police.

Valley Hospital, where he died from his injuries the next day.

The autopsy findings show the Cole had bluntforce trauma to his torso. including abrasions on his shoulders, back and left lower chest; lacerations to his left shoulder and back; and fracture of his sternum and multiple ribs.

He also had blunt-force trauma of his extremities. including bruises on his right arm, abrasions on his arms, left knee and legs, and a gunshot in his left arm.

The Ohio Attorney Gener-Center Boulevard on a report al's Office was appointed as a special prosecutor for the case of Cole's death.

The Clark County Prosecutor's Office requested that Ohio Attorney General Dave Yost's office be appointed as Cole was flown to Miami a Special Prosecutor in the matter of the death of Cole "to ensure that there was no appearance of a Conflict of Interest in this case," a press release from the prosecutor's office stated.

The Ohio State Highway Patrol is conducting the investigation into the accident involving Rosales, and the Springfield Police Division is investigating the shooting. Both investigations are still ongoing.

According to the OSHP crash report, "(the police cruiser) was driving south on South Center Boulevard in emergency response. (The police cruiser) struck a pedestrian (Cole) laying in the roadway."

The crash report states that Rosales was in emer gency response with her overhead lights activated. and was distracted by something outside of the vehicle.

Springfield Police Chief Lee Graf previously said Rosales did not see Cole on the street because she was reportedly looking at houses for addresses and the officer stopped immediately and began to render aid after the incident.

"This was an accident," Graf said at a press conference held in June. "That doesn't mean it's OK. This was not an intentional act by the officer. I am sure of that."

Rosales, who has been with the department for over a year, was placed on administrative leave, which is stan-

dard procedure, Graf said in June. She remains on leave as the internal investigation is ongoing.

Cole's family demanded answers from the police department and raised concerns at the June press conference.

The News-Sun reached out to the family for comment, but had not received a response late Friday afternoon.

Rosales' cruiser camera shows the vehicle making its way to the scene of the incident. As the cruiser pulls onto South Center Boulevard, you can see Cole lying on the left side of the road in a white shirt, with blood on it, and blue shorts. The cruiser then strikes Cole and stops, the video shows.

A second video shows a separate cruiser following behind Rosales. As the two pull up to the scene, Cole is shown lying on the left side in the road as the cruiser strikes him. Rosales then gets out of her cruiser and runs to aid Cole, as do other officers.

Cole's death has also been the subject of community demonstrations, with attendees demanding justice and accountability for Cole. More than 100 people gathered at the end of June in downtown Springfield, saying they want the officer involved in the incident to be held accountable and called for more transparency surrounding the case.

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
