Narrative:

On December 21, 2022, the Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation (BCI) was requested to investigate the facts and circumstances surrounding an Officer-Involved Critical Incident (OICI) that occurred at Sidney Foodtown, located at 1010 Wapakoneta Avenue, Sidney, Shelby County, Ohio. The OICI occurred when Sidney police officers encountered Todd I. Jordan (Jordan), who was armed with a gun inside Sidney Foodtown.

On December 21, 2022, at approximately 1140 hours, BCI Special Agent Chris Hamberg (SA Hamberg) interviewed Ida Spangler (Spangler) in an interview room at the Sidney Police Department. The interview was digitally recorded. The audio file is attached to the case file.

The purpose of the interview was to ascertain what Spangler may have witnessed at the Foodtown grocery store in regard to the OICI incident.

Spangler stated she was a customer at the store and arrived at approximately 0800 hours. Spangler advised SA Hamberg she made her way back to the milk coolers when she heard a loud bang. She asked one of the men that was stocking the shelves what the noise was. Spangler stated a few seconds later another employee, Dan Wourms (Wourms), came from the front of the store and helped her and two (2) other employees get inside the dairy cooler. Spangler added they stayed inside the dairy cooler until the police arrived and told them they could get out and they were told to exit the building out the backdoor.

SA Hamberg asked Spangler if she knew what the loud noise was that she heard and if the noise came from inside the store. Spangler said she did not know what the noise was, but it came from inside the store. SA Hamberg asked Spangler if she witnessed the shooting incident, when Spangler stated she did not. Spangler was asked if she called 911 with her cell phone, when Spangler stated no, as she left her cell phone inside her car. Spangler had nothing further to

provide in regard to the incident.
