APPROVAL—CONTRACT BY AND BETWEEN THE STATE OF OHIO FOR BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF KENT STATE UNIVERSITY, HARRY A. FULTON, ARCHITECT OF CLEVELAND, OHIO, FOR PREPARATION OF PLANS AND SPECIFICATIONS FOR A NEW WOMEN'S DORMITORY.

COLUMBUS, OHIO, November 19, 1937.

DEAR SIR: You have submitted for my approval a contract by and between the State of Ohio, acting by Carl G. Wahl, Director of Public Works, on behalf of the Board of Trustees of Kent State University, Kent, Ohio, and Harry A. Fulton, Architect, Cleveland, Ohio, for the preparation of plans and specifications for a new Women's Dormitory to be known as "Engleman Hall" and an "Addition to Lowry Hall," which contract calls for the services of the Architect to be compensated on the basis of five and one-half per cent (5½%) of the amount paid out by the State of Ohio under and on account of contracts entered into by the State for the construction of said improvement.

The contract shows the approval by the Board of Trustees of Kent State University, the approval being dated October 19, 1937. Attached to each copy of the contract is a certificate of the Business Manager of Kent State University certifying the deposit with the First-Central Trust Company, Akron, Ohio, of the sum of \$297,976.52 to the credit of the Kent State University Dormitory Fund, and also certifying that there is available the sum of \$16,981.66 for the Architect's fees at the rate of five and one-half per cent $(5\frac{1}{2}\%)$ of the contract.

Finding said contract in the proper legal form, I have this day noted my approval thereon and return the same herewith to you.
