Narrative:

On December 27, 2022, Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation (BC)I Special Agent Perry Roeser received a thumb drive (reference #1) from Sidney Police Captain Jerry Tangeman regarding documents related to the Officer–Involved Critical incident under BCI investigation. The records included personnel files for all involved officers, training/firearms qualifications, Use of Force Policies, BWC, discipline files, 911 calls, dispatch radio traffic, First Aid Policy, and all incident reports from the scene. Some files were sent to SA Roeser electronically days after the incident.

All the files, videos, and documents have been reviewed and loaded onto BCI's Matrix case file system.

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Use of Force

300.1 PURPOSE AND SCOPE

This policy provides guidelines on the reasonable use of force. While there is no way to specify the exact amount or type of reasonable force to be applied in any situation, every member of this department is expected to use these guidelines to make such decisions in a professional, impartial, and reasonable manner.

In addition to those methods, techniques, and tools set forth below, the guidelines for the reasonable application of force contained in this policy shall apply to all policies addressing the potential use of force, including but not limited to the Control Devices and Techniques and Conducted Energy Device policies.

300.1.1 DEFINITIONS Definitions related to this policy include:

Deadly force - Force reasonably anticipated and intended to create a substantial likelihood of causing death or very serious injury.

Feasible - Reasonably capable of being done or carried out under the circumstances to successfully achieve the arrest or lawful objective without increasing risk to the officer or another person.

Force - The application of physical techniques or tactics, chemical agents, or weapons to another person. It is not a use of force when a person allows him/herself to be searched, escorted, handcuffed, or restrained.

Imminent - Ready to take place; impending. Note that imminent does not mean immediate or instantaneous.

Totality of the circumstances - All facts and circumstances known to the officer at the time, taken as a whole, including the conduct of the officer and the subject leading up to the use of force.

300.2 POLICY

The use of force by law enforcement personnel is a matter of critical concern, both to the public and to the law enforcement community. Officers are involved on a daily basis in numerous and varied interactions and, when warranted, may use reasonable force in carrying out their duties.

Officers must have an understanding of, and true appreciation for, their authority and limitations. This is especially true with respect to overcoming resistance while engaged in the performance of law enforcement duties.

The Sidney Police Department recognizes and respects the value of all human life and dignity without prejudice to anyone. Vesting officers with the authority to use reasonable force and to protect the public welfare requires monitoring, evaluation, and a careful balancing of all interests.

Sidney PD Policy Manual

It is the policy of the Sidney Police Department to only exercise the authority granted by law. All members shall observe and comply with every person's clearly established rights under the United States and Ohio Constitutions. The department will also adhere to all applicable federal, state, and local laws.

300.2.1 DUTY TO INTERCEDE AND REPORT

Any officer present and observing another law enforcement officer or a member using force that is clearly beyond that which is objectively reasonable under the circumstances shall, when in a position to do so, intercede to prevent the use of unreasonable force.

Any officer who observes another law enforcement officer or a member use force that is potentially beyond that which is objectively reasonable under the circumstances should report these observations to a supervisor.

300.2.2 PERSPECTIVE

When observing or reporting force used by a law enforcement officer, each officer should take into account the totality of the circumstances and the possibility that other law enforcement officers may have additional information regarding the threat posed by the subject.

300.3 USE OF FORCE

Officers shall use only that amount of force that reasonably appears necessary given the facts and circumstances perceived by the officer at the time of the event to accomplish a legitimate law enforcement purpose.

The reasonableness of force will be judged from the perspective of a reasonable officer on the scene at the time of the incident. Any evaluation of reasonableness must allow for the fact that officers are often forced to make split-second decisions about the amount of force that reasonably appears necessary in a particular situation, with limited information and in circumstances that are tense, uncertain and rapidly evolving.

Given that no policy can realistically predict every possible situation an officer might encounter, officers are entrusted to use well-reasoned discretion in determining the appropriate use of force in each incident.

It is also recognized that circumstances may arise in which officers reasonably believe that it would be impractical or ineffective to use any of the tools, weapons or methods provided by this department. Officers may find it more effective or reasonable to improvise their response to rapidly unfolding conditions that they are confronting. In such circumstances, the use of any improvised device or method must nonetheless be reasonable and utilized only to the degree that reasonably appears necessary to accomplish a legitimate law enforcement purpose.

While the ultimate objective of every law enforcement encounter is to avoid or minimize injury, nothing in this policy requires an officer to retreat or be exposed to possible physical injury before applying reasonable force.

300.3.1 USE OF FORCE TO EFFECT AN ARREST

Any officer who has reasonable cause to believe that the person to be arrested has committed a crime or public offense may use reasonable force to effect the arrest, to prevent escape or to overcome resistance. An officer who makes or attempts to make an arrest need not retreat or desist from his/her efforts by reason of resistance or threatened resistance on the part of the person being arrested, nor shall an officer be deemed the aggressor or lose his/her right to self-defense by the use of reasonable force to effect the arrest, prevent escape or to overcome resistance.

300.3.2 FACTORS USED TO DETERMINE THE REASONABLENESS OF FORCE

When determining whether to apply force and evaluating whether an officer has used reasonable force, a number of factors should be taken into consideration, as time and circumstances permit. These factors include but are not limited to:

- (a) Immediacy and severity of the threat to officers or others.
- (b) The conduct of the individual being confronted, as reasonably perceived by the officer at the time.
- (c) Officer/subject factors (e.g.,age, size, relative strength, skill level, injuries sustained, level of exhaustion or fatigue, the number of officers available vs. subjects).
- (d) The effects of suspected drug or alcohol use.
- (e) The individual's mental state or capacity.
- (f) The individual's ability to understand and comply with officer commands.
- (g) Proximity of weapons or dangerous improvised devices.
- (h) The degree to which the individual has been effectively restrained and his/her ability to resist despite being restrained.
- (i) The availability of other reasonable and feasible options and their possible effectiveness.
- (j) Seriousness of the suspected offense or reason for contact with the individual.
- (k) Training and experience of the officer.
- (I) Potential for injury to officers, suspects, and others.
- (m) Whether the individual appears to be resisting, attempting to evade arrest by flight, or is attacking the officer.
- (n) The risk and reasonably foreseeable consequences of escape.
- (o) The apparent need for immediate control of the individual or a prompt resolution of the situation.
- (p) Whether the conduct of the individual being confronted no longer reasonably appears to pose an imminent threat to the officer or others.
- (q) Prior contacts with the individual or awareness of any propensity for violence.
- (r) Any other exigent circumstances.

300.3.3 CAROTID CONTROL HOLD

A carotid control hold is a technique designed to control an individual by temporarily restricting blood flow through the application of pressure to the side of the neck and, unlike a chokehold, does not restrict the airway. The proper application of the carotid control hold may be effective in restraining a violent or combative individual. However, due to the potential for injury, the use of the carotid control hold is limited to those circumstances where deadly force is authorized and is subject to the following:

- (a) When reasonable and practicable the response of the individual should be monitored. The carotid control hold should be discontinued when circumstances indicate that the application no longer reasonably appears necessary.
- (b) Any individual who has had the carotid control hold applied, regardless of whether he/ she was rendered unconscious, shall be promptly examined by paramedics or other qualified medical personnel and should be monitored until such examination occurs.
- (c) The officer shall inform any person receiving custody, or any person placed in a position of providing care, that the individual has been subjected to the carotid control hold and whether the individual lost consciousness as a result.
- (d) Any officer attempting or applying the carotid control hold shall promptly notify a supervisor of the use or attempted use of such hold. The supervisor shall then notify the Operations Captain with details fo the event.
- (e) The use or attempted use of the carotid control hold shall be thoroughly documented by the officer in a response to resistance report. This report will be reviewed by the Operations Captain and the Chief of Police.

300.3.4 CHOKEHOLDS

Chokeholds or any holds which restrict the airway will be prohibited except in situations where the use of deadly force is allowed by law and is subject to the following:

- (a) When reasonable and practicable the response of the individual should be monitored. The chokehold should be discontinued when circumstances indicate that the application no longer reasonably appears necessary.
- (b) Any individual who has a chokehold applied, regardless of whether he/she was rendered unconscious, shall be promptly examined by paramedics or other qualified medical personnel and should be monitored until such examination occurs.
- (c) The officer shall inform any person receiving custody, or any person placed in a position of providing care, that the individual has be subjected to the carotid control hold and whether the individual lost consciousness as a result.
- (d) Any officer attempting or applying a chokehold shall promptly notify a supervisor of the use or attempted use of such a hold. The supervisor shall then notify the Operations Captain with details of the event.
- (e) The use or attempted use of a chokehold shall be thoroughly documented by the officer and their supervisor in a response to resistance report. This report will be reviewed by the Operations Captain and the Chief of Police.

300.3.5 USE OF FORCE TO SEIZE EVIDENCE

In general, officers may use reasonable force to lawfully seize evidence and to prevent the destruction of evidence. However, officers are discouraged from using force solely to prevent a person from swallowing evidence or contraband. In the instance when force is used, officers should not intentionally use any technique that restricts blood flow to the head, restricts respiration or which creates a reasonable likelihood that blood flow to the head or respiration would be restricted.

300.3.6 ALTERNATIVE TACTICS - DE-ESCALATION

When circumstances reasonably permit, officers should use non-violent strategies and techniques to decrease the intensity of a situation, improve decision-making, improve communication, reduce the need for force, and increase voluntary compliance (e.g., summoning additional resources, formulating a plan, attempting verbal persuasion).

300.4 DEADLY FORCE APPLICATIONS

When reasonable, the officer shall, prior to the use of deadly force, make efforts to identify him/ herself as a peace officer and to warn that deadly force may be used, unless the officer has objectively reasonable grounds to believe the person is aware of those facts.

Use of deadly force is justified in the following circumstances involving imminent threat or imminent risk:

- (a) An officer may use deadly force to protect him/herself or others from what he/she reasonably believes is an imminent threat of death or serious bodily injury.
- (b) An officer may use deadly force to stop a fleeing subject when the officer has probable cause to believe that the individual has committed, or intends to commit, a felony involving the infliction or threatened infliction of serious bodily injury or death, and the officer reasonably believes that there is an imminent risk of serious bodily injury or death to any other person if the individual is not immediately apprehended. Under such circumstances, a verbal warning should precede the use of deadly force, where feasible.

Imminent does not mean immediate or instantaneous. An imminent danger may exist even if the suspect is not at that very moment pointing a weapon at someone. For example, an imminent danger may exist if an officer reasonably believes that the individual has a weapon or is attempting to access one and intends to use it against the officer or another person. An imminent danger may also exist if the individual is capable of causing serious bodily injury or death without a weapon, and the officer believes the individual intends to do so.

300.4.1 MOVING VEHICLES

Shots fired at or from a moving vehicle involve additional considerations and risks, and are rarely effective.

When feasible officers should take reasonable steps to move out of the path of an approaching vehicle instead of discharging their firearm at the vehicle or any of its occupants.

An officer should only discharge a firearm at a moving vehicle or its occupants when the officer reasonably believes there are no other reasonable means available to avert the imminent threat of the vehicle, or if deadly force other than the vehicle is directed at the officer or others.

Officers should not shoot at any part of a vehicle in an attempt to disable the vehicle unless an occupant of the car poses a significant physical danger to the officer or others in the community.

300.5 REPORTING THE USE OF FORCE

Any use of force by a member of this department shall be documented promptly, completely, and accurately in an appropriate report, depending on the nature of the incident. The officer should articulate the factors perceived and why he/she believed the use of force was reasonable under the circumstances.

To collect data for purposes of training, resource allocation, analysis, and related purposes, the Department may require the completion of additional report forms, as specified in department policy, procedure, or law. See the Report Preparation Policy for additional circumstances that may require documentation.

300.5.1 NOTIFICATIONS TO SUPERVISORS

Supervisory notification shall be made as soon as practicable following the application of force in any of the following circumstances:

- (a) The application caused a visible injury.
- (b) The application would lead a reasonable officer to conclude that the individual may have experienced more than momentary discomfort.
- (c) The individual subjected to the force complained of injury or continuing pain.
- (d) The individual indicates intent to pursue litigation.
- (e) Any application of the TASER device or control device.
- (f) Any application of a restraint device other than handcuffs, shackles, or belly chains.
- (g) The individual subjected to the force was rendered unconscious.
- (h) An individual was struck or kicked.
- (i) An individual alleges unreasonable force was used or that any of the above has occurred.
- (j) Any discharge of firearm (lethal and non-lethal).

300.6 MEDICAL CONSIDERATIONS

Once it is reasonably safe to do so, medical assistance shall be obtained for any person who exhibits signs of physical distress, has sustained visible injury, expresses a complaint of injury or continuing pain, or was rendered unconscious. Any individual exhibiting signs of physical distress after an encounter should be continuously monitored until the individual can be medically assessed. Individuals should not be placed on their stomachs for an extended period, as this could impair their ability to breathe.

Based upon the officer's initial assessment of the nature and extent of the individual's injuries, medical assistance may consist of examination by an emergency medical services provider or medical personnel, at a hospital or jail. If any such individual refuses medical attention, such a refusal shall be fully documented in related reports and, whenever practicable, should be witnessed by another officer and/or medical personnel. If a recording is made of the contact or an interview with the individual, any refusal should be included in the recording, if possible.

The on-scene supervisor or, if the on-scene supervisor is not available, the primary handling officer shall ensure that any person providing medical care or receiving custody of a person following any use of force is informed that the person was subjected to force. This notification shall include a description of the force used and any other circumstances the officer reasonably believes would be potential safety or medical risks to the subject (e.g., prolonged struggle, extreme agitation, impaired respiration).

Individuals who exhibit extreme agitation, violent irrational behavior accompanied by profuse sweating, extraordinary strength beyond their physical characteristics, and imperviousness to pain, or who require a protracted physical encounter with multiple officers to be brought under control, may be at an increased risk of sudden death. Calls involving these persons should be considered medical emergencies. Officers who reasonably suspect a medical emergency should request medical assistance as soon as practicable and have medical personnel stage away.

See the Medical Aid and Response Policy for additional guidelines.

300.7 SUPERVISOR RESPONSIBILITIES

A supervisor should respond to a reported application of force resulting in visible injury, if reasonably available. When a supervisor is able to respond to an incident in which there has been a reported application of force, the supervisor is expected to:

- (a) Obtain the basic facts from the involved officers. Absent an allegation of misconduct or excessive force, this will be considered a routine contact in the normal course of duties.
- (b) Ensure that any injured parties are examined and treated.
- (c) When possible, separately obtain a recorded interview with the individual upon whom force was applied. If this interview is conducted without the individual having voluntarily waived his/her *Miranda* rights, the following shall apply:
 - 1. The content of the interview should not be summarized or included in any related criminal charges.
 - 2. The fact that a recorded interview was conducted should be documented in a property or other report.
 - 3. The recording of the interview should be distinctly marked for retention until all potential for civil litigation has expired.

- (d) Once any initial medical assessment has been completed or first aid has been rendered, ensure that photographs have been taken of any areas involving visible injury or complaint of pain, as well as overall photographs of uninjured areas.
 - 1. These photographs should be retained until all potential for civil litigation has expired.
- (e) Identify any witnesses not already included in related reports. Interview all witnesses and get a written or audio statement from them on what they saw/observed.
- (f) Review and approve all related reports.
- (g) Determine if there is any indication that the individual may pursue civil litigation.
 - 1. If there is an indication of potential civil litigation, the supervisor should complete and route a notification of a potential claim through the appropriate channels.
- (h) Evaluate the circumstances surrounding the incident and initiate an administrative investigation if there is a question of policy noncompliance or if for any reason further investigation may be appropriate.

In the event that a supervisor is unable to respond to the scene of an incident involving the reported application of force, the supervisor is still expected to complete as many of the above items as circumstances permit. The supervisor will ensure that the use of force is completed by the individual prior to completing their shift. If there are any questions about the use of force or items needed completed the supervisor will contact the Operations Captain for further guidance.

300.7.1 SHIFT SERGEANT RESPONSIBILITY

The Shift Sergeant shall review each use of force by any personnel within his/her command to ensure compliance with this policy and to address any training issues.

300.8 TRAINING

Officers will receive periodic training on this policy and demonstrate their knowledge and understanding, at least annually, including use of deadly force, use of force and use of deadly force reporting, and use of force and use of deadly force reviews/investigations.

Subject to available resources, officers should receive periodic training on:

- (a) Guidelines regarding vulnerable populations, including but not limited to children, elderly, pregnant persons, and individuals with physical, mental, or intellectual disabilities.
- (b) De-escalation tactics, including alternatives to force.

300.9 USE OF FORCE ANALYSIS

At least annually, the Patrol Captain should prepare an analysis report on use of force incidents. The report should be submitted to the Chief of Police. The report should include but not limited to:

- (a) The identification of any trends in the use of force by members.
- (b) Training needs recommendations.

- Equipment needs recommendations. (c)
- (d) Policy revision recommendations.

INCIDENT REPORT

A SHORT TIME LATER I HEARD OFFICER KENNEDY GET DISPATCHED TO THE AREA OF THE OLD TTT BAR TO INVESTIGATE AN INTOXICATED MALE WHO HAD URINATED IN PUBLIC BEFORE LEAVING NORTH BOUND IN A BLACK TRACKER. DISPATCH REPORTED THE DRIVER WAS AN INTOX WHITE MALE WITH A WHITE FEMALE PASSENGER AND WAS HAVING DIFFICULTY SHIFTING THE VEHICLE.

I LEFT THE PARKING LOT AND BEGAN TO CATCH UP WITH THE SUSPECT VEHICLE. I CAUGHT UP TO THE VEHICLE ON BROADWAY NEAR APOLLO AND INITIATED A TRAFFIC STOP. I WAS NOT ABLE TO READ THE PLATE FROM A DISTANCE DUE TO A PLATE COVER BUT WAS ABLE TO CONFIRM IT WAS THE SUSPECT PLATE AS I GOT CLOSE AND MADE THE STOP.

I WAS IN CRUISER #12. THE CAMERA AND IN CAR AUDIO WAS WORKING HOWEVER I FOUND OUT LATER THE PORTABLE MIC WAS NOT OPERATING. POSSIBLY DUE TO INSUFFICIENT BATTERY.

I APPROACHED THE CAR AND MADE CONTACT WITH THE DRIVER TODD JORDAN. I COULD SMELL THE ODOR OF AN ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE AND NOTICED HIS EYES APPEARED GLASSY. I ALSO SAW HIS ZIPPER WAS DOWN AND THERE WAS AN OPEN CAN OF BEER IN THE CENTER CONSOL. WHEN I ASKED TODD FOR HIS DRIVERS LICENSE IT TOOK HIM A WHILE TO FIND IT. I COULD SEE THE BACK OF HIS LICENSE IN THE FRONT OF THE RIGHT SIDE OF HIS WALLET BUT HE CHECKED EVERY CARD IN THE LEFT SIDE BEFORE MOVING TO THE RIGHT SIDE, CHECKING EVERY CARD IN THE BACK AND EVENTUALLY FINDING THE ID CARD. HE ALSO LOCATED AN O.L. FOR ANOTHER MALE THAT HE CLAIMED WAS A FRIEND OF HIS WHO HAD DROPPED HIS I.D. I ALSO ASKED TODD HOW MUCH HE HAD TO DRINK TODAY AND HE SAID "A COUPLE OF BEERS". I ASKED HIM HOW LONG AGO AND HE SAID "AN HOUR OR SO AGO".

OFF. KENNEDY ARRIVED ABOUT THIS TIME AND I CHECKED TODD'S ID WITH DISPATCH AND LEARNED HE WAS UNDER SEVERAL SUSPENSIONS. I THEN APPROACHED THE VEHICLE AGAIN AND ASKED TODD TO STEP OUT. AT THE FRONT CORNER OF HIS CAR I CHECKED TODD'S EYES WITH OFF. KENNEDY WITNESSING. WE BOTH OBSERVED ALL SIX CLUES. DUE TO THE SLOPE OF THE STREET AND SIDEWALK IN THE AREA I DID NOT ATTEMPT TO HAVE TODD DO THE WALK AND TURN OR ONE LEGGED STAND. BASED ON THE NUMEROUS INDICATORS AND HIGH HGN TEST TODD WAS ARRESTED FOR OVI.

I THEN SPOKE TO HIS GIRLFRIEND AND OWNER OF THE CAR ANNETTE WOODDELL. I ASKED HER ABOUT TODD'S DRINKING. SHE EXPLAINED THAT REHAB HAD NOT BEEN HELPING HIM. I ASKED HER WHY SHE LET HIM DRIVE. SHE EXPLAINED THEY WERE AFRAID OF THE GUY THEY HAD ARGUED WITH DOWNTOWN AND HE HAD GOTTEN IN THE DRIVERS SEAT TO GET HER AWAY FROM HIM. I CAUTIONED HER ABOUT ALLOWING HER UNLICENSED, INTOXICATED BOYFRIEND DRIVE HER VEHICLE. ANNETTE APPEARED TO BE INTIMIDATED BY TODD BUT AGREED SHE WOULD NOT BE ABLE TO LIVE WITH HERSELF IF HE HURT SOMEONE DRIVING HER VEHICLE. I THEN ARRANGED FOR ANNETTE TO COME TO THE POLICE DEPARTMENT IN ABOUT 40 MINUTES TO PICK TODD UP.

On September 9, 2021 I was dispatched to 2805 Wapakoneta Ave. lot 48 in reference to a stolen cell phone. I arrived and spoke with Annette Wooddell and her boyfriend Todd Jordan. Wooddell advised that she was at Speedway North (Main and Russell Rd.) and she laid her cell phone down near the food rollers and she realized she left it when she got back home. She went back to Speedway and couldn't find it where she laid it, and they advised that they gave it to a male who told them that the phone was his. They called her phone (937-489-3147) and no one answered the phone, so she text it claiming that the phone had a tracker on it. The male contacted her back and he agreed to meet them at Speedway to return the phone. When he arrived he handed her the phone and acted like everything was okay, and wanted to shake their hands. Todd stated that he told the male that he stole the phone, and the male then started to act like he was wanting to start problems with him. The male got into a Silver/ bronze 2 door (possibly 90's Honda), and a white skinny red hair female was driving with 2 children in the back seat. They stated the male was a white male with only 2 teeth, dark hair, skinny, 5-9, in his 30's, with full arm sleeves. Todd advised that when the female was pulling away, the male opened the door a fell out of the vehicle, and then got up and started at him like he was going to fight him, and he went towards the male and didn't back down. The male then got back into the vehicle and left the area on Main Ave.

Wooddell advised that her phone's SIM card was tampered with, and she is unsure if it belongs with the phone. She also couldn't get into her phone from the male tampering with it. She advised she does all her finances on her phone, and she is concerned if he got her information. I told her to monitor it, and have someone help her with the technical parts of the phone.

I went to Speedway and spoke with Employee Lisa Williams. She advised they found the Phone in the store by the rollers, and a male who called kept himself Joe told them it was his phone. She also advised that he had no teeth, was 5-5, dark hair, in his 30' looked scroungey. The store manager (Grace) advised that the video system on the computer was down, but is scheduled to be fixed. She advised another Officer is coming in from 1st shift on Saturday for video, so I asked if she could give the information to him when he comes in.

Wooddell called me back and advised that they found a male named Joey Stone on Facebook, who they believe is the male that stole her phone. I went to 1113 Hill Top Apt. E and spoke with Stone, and he advised that when the clerk asked him if it was his phone he felt his pockets and didn't feel his so he told her it was his. He then found out after he took it that it wasn't his from the victim, and returned it. I asked about why he messed with the phone and removed the SIM card. He told me that the kids probably messed with it, and then told me that he would go get a card for me. He went inside and came out without a card, so I asked him about the card again. At that point his girlfriend Brittany Young pulled up and Brittany gave him a phone front the front seat area, after he asked for it. He pulled out the SIM card and told me to check the card in the victims phone, because he is unsure if it is the SIM card. Joe was limping around and claiming his toe / foot may be broke from hitting something in the house. I asked him if he meant from rolling out of the vehicle, and he stated that could be the reason also.

I told Joe to come to the PD on Saturday to pick up a theft charge summons and warned him if he didn't show up I would request a warrant for him. I returned to the victims residence to see if the SIM card belonged to her phone and it didn't. She advised that she already called boost mobile and they also advised the SIM card that was in the phone when Joe returned it to them, didn't belong to the phone. She also advised that he was trying to get into her online pay account, but now her account is locked from him messing with it.

The SIM card that was in the victim's was placed into evidence.

Charges for the theft will be prepared for Stone and he will be served if he comes in on Saturday.

Responded to 744 Brooklyn lot 16 on the report of homeless people trespassing on the property of the trailer park. Upon arrival I spoke with Todd Jordan. He advised that a homeless man and a child were on the property. He said that he confronted them and they became involved in a verbal altercation. He told me that he believed that they were living in the woods behind his trailer on property owned by the Catholic Church. I went into the woods but could not find any type of homeless encampment. As I was walking out a saw the male and child down along the river to the south of the trailer park.

I made contact with the subjects, a small child and a late teens early twenties male. I asked him if he was in a verbal altercation with the rp. He advised that he was. He then showed me video of the rp on the river bank yelling at him. They yelled back and fourth at each other for a few minutes. As I was speaking with the male a female came down who I eventually recognized to be Stephanie Strunk. She said that they were her kids. I spoke with the group further and learned that the male and the small child lived with Stephanie's mother on Brooklyn. They advised me that they were just down in the river playing and looking for turtles and frogs. I advised them that they were allowed in the river but not to be on the property of the trailer park. I advised them to find a route down to the river that kept them off the property.

I returned and talked further with the rp and explained to him that the people he was referring to were in fact not homeless and that they lived on Brooklyn. I advised him of what they were doing. He said that it was fine as long as they stayed off the property. I advised him that they were allowed to be in the river as the state owns the river bottom. The rp wanted to argue this fact with me and believed that the property line went out to the middle of the river. The rp refused to believe me.

The rp did make comments about hurting people that come onto "his" property.

Annette advised Todd threatened to hit her with his car, would kill her if she did not meet up with him, etc. Annette advised she would not like any charges placed against Todd, but wanted the incident documented. Annette was advised to stop all communications with Todd.

We spoke to Todd at his home located at 744 Brooklyn Ave. Lot 16. He advised he did not send any messages to Annette. He was advised to no longer communicate with Annette, and she would do the same. When leaving, Todd made comments about hitting Annette with his car if she happened to be in the street.

I called Annette and told her about our communication with Todd. Once again she was reminded to not communicate with Todd.

Todd advised over the telephone he does not fully remember when it happened but has recordings from Sherri Redibo who is a friend of Annette stating she had placed multiple pills of Oxycotin in his drink.

Todd stated sometime in early Oct he was with Sherri and Annette but does not remember anything that night but was told he almost died. Todd advised no medics were called. Todd stated he has two voice mails that he got from Sherri that has Annette stating she was drugging Todd with Oxycotin. Todd advised Annette and him were boyfriend and girlfriend for sometime but he broke up with her last year. Todd stated he is friends with Sherri who is best friends with Annette.

Todd showed me on his cell phone two voicemails from Annette that he got sent to from Sherri Redibo on Oct 10 2022. The voicemails could not be played at this time due to Todd's data usage was up. I advised Todd to come back tomorrow around 0900 hrs to speak with me again, bring his cell phone with him and with his signature on a consent to search form. One of our computer guys can obtain the information from his cell phone.

At this time, the report is filed through and I will do further investigation on this case.

On 10-27-22 I made contact with Annette Woodell at her residence of 2805 Wapakoneta Ave Lot 48. While speaking with Annette, I read Annette her Miranda Rights and started to ask questions concerning Todd Jordan being drugged by her.

Annette advised she was in an abusive relationship with Todd Jordan in Jackson Center, Ohio. Annette stated she received the copy of her talking about drugging Todd with her now ex friend Sherri Redinbo last month. Annette stated the incident occurred 10 years ago in Jackson Center and she did not want to kill him, just to shut him up and have him passed out because he was verbally and physically abusive when he drinks.

Annette advised Todd had attacked her son earlier because of his drinking and just wanted him to stop. Annette advised Sherri is upset with her because she (Annette) will not allow Sherri to come over to do meth and drink. Annette advised she has a job now and got out of the partying stage. Annette stated Sherri lives somewhere up in Hilltop Area and drives a white car.

After leaving Annette's residence, I went to Hilltop Apartments and located Sherri Redinbo at 1201 Apt A. I spoke with Sherri who advised she was talking with Annette about a month ago about things and Annette broke down when Todd's name was brought up about being abusive. Sherri advised the incident with dropping oxy's in Todd's drink occurred up in Jackson Center, long time ago in the trailer park.

All conversations were recorded on my BWC and placed under investigation.

Initial Narrative By Lynn Marsee

I was transferred a call in reference to a male advising he had been drugged by his ex girlfriend several years ago somewhere in Lockington. I spoke to Todd Jordan who advised his ex Annette Wooddell had drugged him and tried to kill him about 4 years ago somewhere in Lockington. Jordan advised he didn't remember anything from the incident that a friend (Sherry Rettenboe unknown on actually spelling) of Wooddell had reached out to him on Facebook in the last couple of weeks and sent him a voice recording that Jordan advises is Wooddell admitting to drugging him in an attempt to kill him. Jordan advised that he had a document that was a forged Will that Wooddell made for Jordan before the incident. Jordan advised that there was another incident that Wooddell admitted in the recording that occurred in Jackson Center where she had dropped 3 Oxytocins into a beer he was drinking. Jordan advised this was around 5 or 6 years ago. Jordan advised the incident in Lockington they had been drinking and Wooddell put a rock of meth in his mouth and made him swallow it. I asked Jordan if he could meet me at the Sheriff's Office on Sunday, November 13, 2022 so that I could listen to the recording and take a look at the document that was supposed to be a forged Will. He advised he could meet me at 0700 hrs.

Supplement:

On Monday, November 14, 2022 at around 0945 hrs. I called Jordan due to him not coming in on Sunday. Jordan advised that the recording was actually from the Jackson Center incident that he had already filed a report with Jackson Center PD about. He was able to provide me with the address in Lockington that the second incident had occurred at as 10389 Blackfox Trail. I advised Jordan due to not having anyway to obtain physical proof that the incident occurred I would be unable to bring any charges against Wooddell, but advised him that I would document his complaint. He advised he understood and thanked me for my time.

Supplement:

On Sunday, November 27, 2022 at around 1105 hrs. I responded to 2805 Wapakoneta Ave Lot 48 in Sidney in attempt to make contact with Annette Wooddell at her residence due to not finding a valid phone number for her. I did not get an answer at the door. I left a business card advised Wooddell to contact me as soon as possible. I did not receive a call before the end of my shift on this day.

Supplement:

On Monday, November 28, 2022 at around 1318 hrs. I responded back to the Wapakoneta Ave address to again try to make contact with Wooddell. I got response at the residence and my business card was on the ground next to the door. I stopped at the building manager's office. It was closed, but there was a number to call for the building manager. I called and left a message for Dave Fleming. At around 1326 hrs. I received a phone call from Fleming who advised me Wooddell does still live at the lot 48 residence. He also advised me Wooddell works at Sidney Food Town and works during the day. I called Sidney Food Town and was able to talk to Wooddell. I asked her if she was familiar with Todd Jordan. Wooddell advised he was her ex boyfriend and that they had dated for 13 years, but had broke up a couple of years ago. I asked her if she knew anything about the incident in Lockington regarding her putting a rock of meth into Jordan's mouth in an attempt to kill him. Wooddell advised that she had never done this and since they had broken up Jordan keeps trying to contact her. Wooddell advised she and almost everyone in her family has blocked him on social media and blocked his phone number to keep him from contacting her. Wooddell advised that Jordan has been kicked out of Sidney Food Town and is no longer aloud in there due to him coming there to try to contact Wooddell while she is at work. Wooddell asked what she can do to get Jordan to leave her alone. I suggested she contact the Sidney Municipal Court and try to get a CPO against Jordan. Due to no evidence this case will be considered closed.
