Narrative:

On September 8, 2025, at approximately 1915 hours, Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation (BCI) Special Agent (SA) Joseph Goudy (Goudy) and SA Jeff Smith (Smith) responded to the Ohio State Highway Patrol, Ashtabula Post, located at 4860 North Ridge Road West, Ashtabula, Ohio, regarding the collection of evidence and officer documentation.

This was in reference to an Officer Involved Critical Incident (OICI) that occurred in the area of Stanhope-Kellogsville Road and Anderson Road in Denmark Township. The incident involved three Ashtabula County Sheriff's Office (ACSO) Deputies (Dep) and one Ohio State Highway Patrol (OSHP) Trooper (Trp.).

SA Goudy and SA Smith met with [REDACTED] who, on the advice of his counsel Lathan Lipperman representing the Ohio State Trooper's Association, had his cell phone on speakerphone to listen in on the interaction. SA Goudy was advised that [REDACTED] would not be providing a statement on this date. SA Goudy advised Attorney Lipperman and [REDACTED] of the process of collecting the duty weapon involved in the incident and taking photos of him.

SA Goudy took four photographs of [REDACTED] while he was dressed in his OSHP uniform. Images 1 – 4 depict [REDACTED] wearing the standard OSHP Trooper uniform with OSHP patches on his shoulders and a OSHP badge on the left side of his chest. [REDACTED] advised this was the uniform he was wearing at the time of the incident.

[REDACTED] still possessed his firearm, and it was secured in his holster on his duty belt. At 1930 hours, the firearm was turned over to SA Goudy along with two additional magazines. SA Goudy noted that the firearm was a Sig Sauer, Model P320, 9mm handgun bearing serial number [REDACTED]. The magazine with the firearm contained 13, Winchester 9mm luger, hollow point rounds with one round removed from the chamber. The two extra magazines were identical to the magazine with the firearm, that held 17, 9mm rounds a piece. Images 5 and 6 are the photos of the duty weapon and magazines received from [REDACTED].

████████████████ was wearing an internal vest at the time of the incident. There was no physical altercation between ██████████ and the decedent in this matter. The firearm, magazine and ammunition were collected, photographed and packaged as evidence.

The total amount of ammunition collected from ██████████ was 14 rounds. The two extra magazines were not collected due to them being full and containing 17 rounds a piece. ██████████ advised that he did not conduct a magazine change during the incident. After a round count was conducted on them to confirm this, they were returned to ██████████.

Based on this information, SA Goudy determined the number of rounds fired by ██████████ was a total of 4 rounds.

This evidence was eventually turned over to SA Charlie Snyder to be transported to the BCI Richfield Office, along with the additional evidence collected from the crime scene and the Ashtabula County Sheriff's Office. All the items were placed into Temporary Evidence and the drying room.
