Narrative:

On December 20, 2022, Special Agent (SA) Josh Rammel (Rammel) and SA Chris Hamberg (Hamberg) conducted an interview with Officer Matthew Baldridge (Baldridge) of the Marion Police Department. The interview was in regard to the officer-involved shooting (OIS) that occurred on the morning of December 20, 2022, along the railroad tracks near North Section Street in LaRue, Ohio. The interview was conducted at the Marion Police Department, located at 233 West Center Street, Marion, Ohio. The interview was recorded using a digital audio recorder. A copy of the interview was attached to this investigation.

The interview began at 1449 hrs. on December 20, 2022. SA Rammel, SA Hamberg and Baldridge all identified themselves as the interview started. Baldridge further provided his date of birth as March 12, 1982, and stated that he currently works for the Marion Police Department. Baldridge also informed SA Rammel and SA Hamberg that he is assigned to a joint drug task force, which includes officers from Marion Police Department and the Marion County Sheriff's Office. Baldridge stated that he has been employed with the Marion Police Department since 2007, and prior to that, several years with the cities of Carey and Kenton Police Departments.

SA Rammel explained the reason for the interview and provided Baldridge with free reign to describe what happened leading up to and during the OIS. Baldridge agreed to continue speaking with SA Rammel and SA Hamberg.

Baldridge advised that after a briefing, he set up in the area around the alleged suspect's residence in LaRue. Once the Special Response Team (SRT) arrived on Swain Avenue, Baldridge pulled up behind them in his unmarked vehicle.

Baldridge indicated that during the course of the search warrant conducted by the SRT, Baldridge remained in his vehicle on Swain Avenue. During this time, Baldridge heard over the radio that the alleged suspect had exited his residence and was walking down the railroad tracks.

Baldridge observed Deputy come back to pick up his K9 from the location where Baldridge was at. Shortly after this is when Baldridge heard multiple gunshots in the distance. Baldridge stated that he heard over the radio that the alleged suspect had been shot, so he went down to North Section Street and assisted the medics with getting the gurney up along

the railroad tracks.

Baldridge said that he heard the gunshots but did not see any of them. Baldridge also said that he was able to hear some of the commands from officers and the alleged suspect yelling back at police.

Baldridge indicated that he was wearing a body camera during this time, but it was not activated due to Baldridge remaining in his vehicle until Baldridge went to assist the medics.

Baldridge advised that he carries his personal Walther 9mm handgun that was not department issued but approved.

Baldridge stated that he did not have any additional information to pass on to SA Rammel and SA Hamberg regarding the OIS but mentioned that the search warrant was based off of Baldridge's investigation and it contained information stemming from 2020.

At that time, the interview was concluded at 1455 hrs.

This report only summarizes the information deemed by the author to be of the most relevance to the investigation and does not purport to contain all questions and answers from the interview. Further, this report was placed in a chronology to aid the reader's overall understanding of the information elicited during the interview and may not be reflective of the actual sequencing of questions. It is suggested that the full recording be reviewed to clarify any content or contextual questions regarding the information from the interview.
