

Investigative Activity: Body Worn Camera & Dash Camera Video Review

Activity Date: August 9, 2023

Activity Location: Area near 45 Great Southern Blvd., Columbus, OH 43207

Authoring Agent: Special Agent Chad Holcomb, #61

Narrative:

Holcomb (SA Holcomb) received body worn camera (BWC) and dash camera video footage from Columbus Police Sergeant Terry McConnell. SA Holcomb was informed that the videos contained footage from the body cameras recorded by CPD Officer Officer Office and Ofc. Seth Casto. CPD Ofc. Heidi Graber, Franklin County Sheriff's Office (FCSO) Deputy Rebecca Eads and FCSO Sgt. Griffin Bluestone's BWC was also reviewed but did not show the shooting as they showed up to the scene after the shooting had already taken place. SA Holcomb also reviewed the dash camera to Ofc.
SA Holcomb documented the portions of the audio/video he believed to be the most relevant in obtaining facts necessary to provide an understanding of the events that took place during the incident. SA Holcomb documented what he believed each subject was saying. For both these reasons mentioned, the reader is encouraged to review the video in its entirety.

At 09:06 into the recording, Ofc. states, "right there" and points towards Huntzinger. At 09:12 into the recording, the vehicle comes to a stop, Ofc. unholsters his weapon and exits the vehicle and yells "Drop it!" At 09:15 into the recording, Ofc. has exited his vehicle and pointed his firearm at Huntzinger. Huntzinger is seen with a firearm in his right hand and is pointing it at Ofc. in a shooting position. Ofc. vells, "Drop it!". Huntzinger is seen falling to the ground behind a Chevrolet SUV with a firearm still in his right



At 09:38 into the recording, Ofc. airs, "Shots fired, officer involved." Ofc along with Ofc. Casto, approach Huntzinger; he is then placed in handcuffs. At 10:12 into the recording, Ofc. airs, "He's down and in custody". Ofc. then checks Huntzinger for any other weapons and begins first-aid and chest compressions. Huntzinger is seen breathing shallowly. At 14:32 into the recording, Ofc. resumes chest compressions. He continually yells that they need the medics. At 15:20 into the recording, another officer takes over first-aid and Ofc. runs to check on Ofc. Ofc. ofc. is later seen being loaded into the ambulance. Ofc. identified himself as a shooting officer to a sergeant. Ofc. was then instructed to turn off his BWC.



At 05:29 into the recording, Ofc Casto radios, "Shots fired, shots fired, officer down". He approaches Huntzinger with Ofc. Ofc. and Ofc. Casto make contact Huntzinger. Ofc Casto then runs over to Ofc.
Ofc. is later seen being loaded into the ambulance. Ofc. Casto identified himself as being involved in the incident to a Sergeant. Ofc. Casto was then instructed to turn off his BWC.

The video begins with Ofc. and Ofc. standing in the parking lot at Deible's talking to civilians regarding their encounter with Huntzinger. They get in their car and begin driving. At 01:40 into the recording, dispatch can be heard saying Huntzinger's location. At 02:10 into the recording, Ofc. is heard saying, "Right there" and Huntzinger is seen getting in the front driver side of a vehicle.
At 02:17 into the recording, the police vehicle comes to a stop and Huntzinger is seen exiting the vehicle with a firearm in his right hand. He is pointing the firearm at Ofc.



Police are heard giving commands to 'drop it'. At 02:21 into the recording, gunshots can be heard. At 02:23 into the recording, Ofc. gets shot and goes to the ground. Gunshots can still be heard. At 02:28 into the recording, Ofc. Casto is seen arriving on scene. At 02:38 into the recording, the last gunshot is heard. Ofc. give is seen self-applying a tourniquet to his right leg. First aid is then seen being administered to Ofc.

ADDITIONAL FACTORS FOR EVALUATING THE VIDEO RECORDINGS

There are numerous other factors that need to be considered when reviewing and evaluating the videos and audio recordings of this incident. Those factors are:

A. Video recording devices record within the video and sound capabilities available, and they record objectively. Video recordings lack the history, perspective, and interest of the people involved. The positions, angles, obstacles, lighting, and distance from the incident are also factors that need serious consideration.

B. Video recording devices also record more information about a particular scene or incident than the person(s) involved in the incident can process during the critical incident. Video



recording devices rarely record an event from the same perspective of any one particular party. It captures the action but not the perception, decision making, focus, or intent of the parties involved. Video recordings can often miss tactile cues or other actions of a subject.

C. The speed of the incident is remarkable. The speed and complexity of rapidly evolving situation(s) that occur during use of force encounters are difficult concepts to comprehend by only watching the video.

The CPD BWC and dash camera video footage has been placed in Evidence.com under 'PIS 2023-0017' as a reference.

A DVD containing the FCSO body camera footage have been placed in the physical BCI case file.
