APPROVAL—CONTRACT FOR ELECTRICAL WORK FOR PROJECT KNOWN AS COTTAGES A AND B, GIRLS' INDUSTRIAL SCHOOL, DELAWARE, OHIO, \$3,137.00, HARTFORD ACCIDENT AND INDEMNITY COMPANY OF HARTFORD, CONN., SURETY—CENTRAL ELECTRICAL SERVICE CO. OF COLUMBUS, OHIO, CONTRACTOR.

HON. CARL G. WAHL, Superintendent of Public Works, Columbus, Ohio.

DEAR SIR: You have submitted for my approval a contract between the State of Ohio, acting by the Department of Public Works, for the Department of Public Welfare, and the Central Electrical Service Co., of Columbus, Ohio. This contract covers the construction and completion of electrical work for a project known as Cottages A and B, Girls' Industrial School, Delaware, Ohio, in accordance with Item No. 4 of the form of proposal dated May 1, 1936. Said contract calls for an expenditure of three thousand one hundred and thirty-seven dollars (\$3,137.00).

You have submitted the certificate of the Director of Finance to the effect that there are unencumbered balances legally appropriated in a sum sufficient to cover the obligations of the contract. You have also submitted certificates of the Controlling Board showing that such board has released funds for this project in accordance with Section 1 of House Bill No. 69 of the second special session of the 90th General Assembly, and Section 1 of House Bill No. 504 of the regular session of the 91st General Assembly.

In addition, you have submitted a contract bond upon which the Hartford Accident and Indemnity Company of Hartford, Connecticut, appears as surety, sufficient to cover the amount of the contract.

You have further submitted evidence indicating that plans were properly prepared and approved, notice to bidders was properly given, bids tabulated as required by law and the contract duly awarded. Also it appears that the laws relating to the status of surety companies and the workmen's compensation have been complied with.

Finding said contract and bond in proper legal form, I have this day noted my approval thereon and return the same herewith to you, together with all other data submitted in this connection.
